

Preston. April 22, 1914.

and programme.
The committee was composed
of Miss Roos, Mrs. Gheuer,
Mrs. Sohrt, Mrs. Kammacher
and Miss Ewald.

Interesting and instructive
papers were read by Mrs.
Grobe, Mrs. Werlich, Miss
Roos and Mrs. Stahlschmidt.
The President gave an
instructive talk on Japan.

The Society decided to
meet in the basement in
May if no home is
offered in the meantime.
Mrs. Merkel offered her
home for the June meeting.

A motion was made
and carried that the

ladies of the Society attend Sunday School the first Sunday in May for the unveiling of the picture of Dr. Mühlberg, and also to distribute pamphlets.

Mrs. Gheuer handed in the sum of \$2.15 which the Confirmation class donated, it being the sum they had left in their treasury.

The Secretary was instructed to write a letter of thanks to the class, addressed to Miss Florence Gheuer, to show our appreciation.

Mrs. Stahlschmidt and her daughter were tendered a hearty vote of thanks for the use of their home. The sum of \$4 was paid in in fees, Mrs. Wirsching gave \$1 and Mrs. C. Blare 50 cts to buy lining for quilts.

The meeting was closed with prayer.
