## GRADUATION PARTICIPATION CARD

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Provided that you meet graduation requirements, a convocation participation card will be mailed to your home address with your final grade report. **It must be presented for you to join the convocation procession.** Should you misplace this card, a duplicate will be available at the ceremony venue prior to the ceremony. You may be asked to provide the correct phonetic pronunciation of your name on this participation card for use by the presenter. Following Senate approval, the list of graduands will be posted on the Laurier website in mid-May.

**Graduates and their guests do NOT require tickets for the ceremony — seating is on a first-come, first-served basis.** Although seating is limited, both complexes should accommodate all who wish to attend. Wheelchair accessibility is limited, and indication of parking availability on the Laurier Campus can be found on page 9 of this invitation. ## ANNUAL SPRING CONVOCATION

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The annual spring convocation of Wilfrid Laurier University will be held for **graduate students** at the **Wilfrid Laurier University Athletic Complex, located at the corner of King Street and University Avenue** and for **undergraduate students** at the **Waterloo Memorial Recreation Complex located at 101 Father David Bauer Drive** on both **Thursday, June 8, 2006** and **Friday, June 9, 2006**.

**On June 8**, a ceremony for **graduate students** will begin at 10 a.m. and you will assemble on the upper level of the Wilfrid Laurier University Athletic Complex no later than 9:15 a.m. A **second ceremony** for **undergraduates** will begin at 1:15 p.m. at the Waterloo Memorial Recreation Complex, and you will assemble on the lower floor of the complex no later than 12:30 p.m.

**On June 9**, both ceremonies will be held at the Waterloo Memorial Recreation Complex. The first ceremony will begin at 10 a.m. and you will assemble on the lower floor of the complex no later than 9:15 a.m. A second ceremony will begin at 2 p.m. and you will assemble on the lower floor of the complex no later than 1:15 p.m.

Regardless of which ceremony you are attending, please have your gown, hood and your participation card with you. See enclosed insert for details regarding gown and hood rentals and returns.

Graduands will line up in twos as per the numeric order on your participation card, and you will be led into the hall as directed by the marshal. **It is essential that this numeric order be maintained in seating.** Graduands will remain standing until the mace has been presented.

## CONFERRING OF DEGREES

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### *( Receiving Degrees )*

The vice-president: academic will introduce the candidates for degrees and diplomas in course. She will say:

*"Will the candidates for degrees and diplomas please rise."*

You will all stand. She will then say:

*"Mister chancellor/president, I have great pleasure in presenting those who have successfully completed the studies prescribed, fulfilled all the conditions thereto appointed, and been recommended for degrees and diplomas by the Senate of the university."*

The chancellor or president will stand and say:

*"In accordance with the laws of the province of Ontario and by virtue of the authority vested in me as chancellor (president), I admit you to the degrees and diplomas as shall be announced by the presenters."*

The vice-president: academic will say:

*"Please be seated."*

Degrees will be conferred in the order listed in the program. The presenter will call forward each graduating class and will present the candidates.



## DOCTORAL, MASTER AND BACHELOR CANDIDATES

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As the presenter calls forward the candidates for the degree, the candidates will rise and move to the left of the platform. An assistant marshal will ask for your procession card for a brief moment to determine the order and composition of those crossing the stage. Graduands will then ascend the platform **individually**, surrender the convocation participation card to the assistant marshal and face the audience while the name is announced by the presenter. The candidate will then walk to the president and chancellor, shake hands, and then proceed to the right of the stage, shake the vice-president: academic's hand and then descend from the platform by the stairs at the right, and return to one's original seat.

## DIPLOMA RECIPIENTS

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Present the convocation participation card to the assistant marshal on stage. As your name is read, proceed across the stage to the chancellor, president and vice-president: academic, all of whom will shake your hand. You will then descend the stairs, and return to your original seat.

## DEGREES AND DIPLOMAS

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Degrees and diplomas will be distributed after the convocation ceremonies at the receptions. The following are the locations where these may be picked up after the respective ceremony. **Please be advised that degrees and diplomas will not be distributed until the ceremony has been dismissed by the chancellor or president.**

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For your convenience, we have included a series of maps which will help direct you to the convocation ceremony, as well as assist you in locating the receptions held following the ceremony.

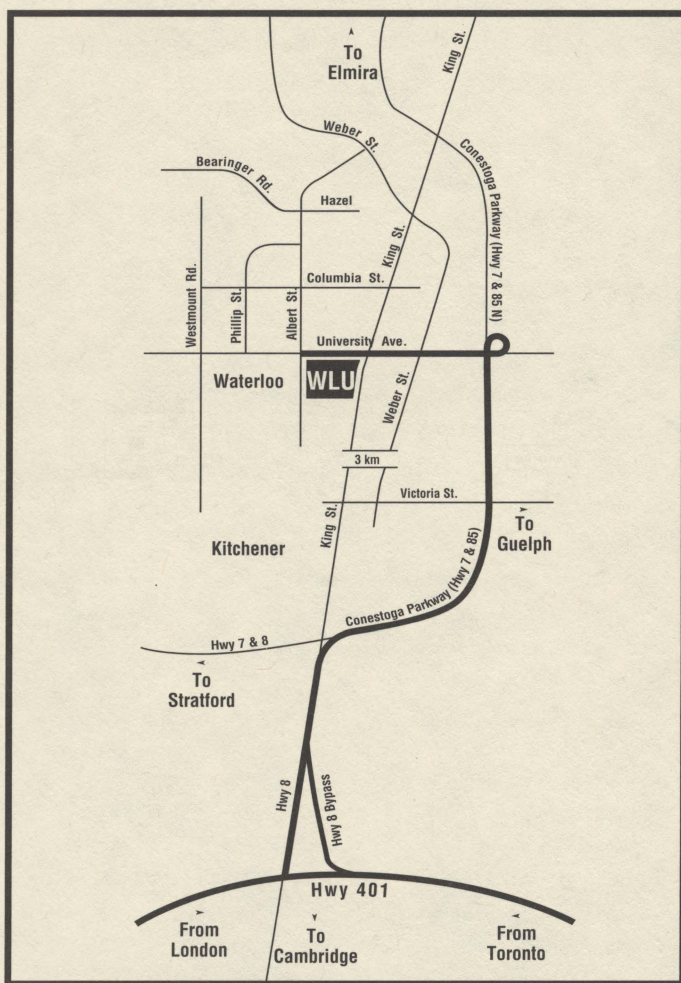
**Parking at both the Athletic Complex and the Waterloo Memorial Recreation Complex is limited.** Parking suggestions include St. Michael's campus, University Stadium, or just off Seagram Drive, walking the short distance to the venues. The maps on the following pages indicate all available parking areas for students and guests, as well as local public transport stops and special needs access while on campus.

## ORIENTATION TO WATERLOO REGION

Waterloo is located 112 km west of Toronto, 104 km northeast of London, 128 km northwest of Niagara Falls, and 66 km northwest of Hamilton. Waterloo is easily reached by Highways 7, 8 and 85 (formerly Highway 86), from Highway 401, which connects Montreal and Windsor and which passes within about 16 km of the Wilfrid Laurier University campus. The community is serviced by train and bus lines. Air service is available through Pearson International Airport in Toronto; limousine or bus service is available from the airport to Waterloo.

*Wilfrid Laurier University*



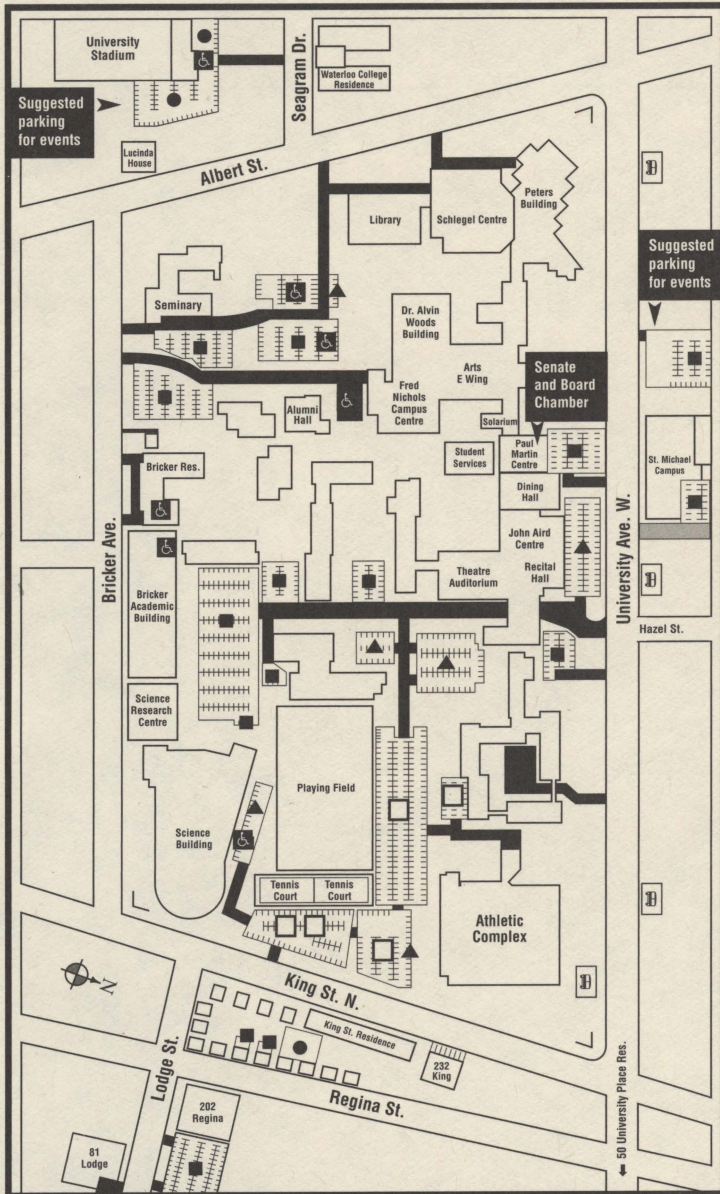
**From Highway 401**
