## Steve Sider wins the Laurier Residence Academic Partner Award

WATERLOO – **Steve Sider**, assistant professor in Wilfrid Laurier University's Faculty of Education, is the recipient of the winter 2015 **Residence Academic Partner Award**.

Sider served as a valuable expert for Laurier's Residence Education team in the establishment of a "Glocal" (global and local) <u>Residence Learning Community</u> (RLC) – a residence community for first year students focused on shaping learning experiences that explore the relationship between global and local issues.

Throughout the semester, Sider worked alongside **Genelle Martin**, a don for the Glocal Residence Learning Community, and contributed his time and expertise to the students, exploring how seemingly small acts have a much larger impact in an increasingly interconnected world.

"It has been a pleasure to work with the Glocal Residence Learning Community this past year," said Sider. "I was thrilled to interact with Genelle Martin and the students, many of whom had extensive experience as learners and activists."

Sider is also part of the co-curricular group <u>Glocal</u>, run in Laurier's Faculty of Education to help educators blend global and local realities. He plans to continue his involvement with the Glocal Residence Learning Community by bringing international opportunities to first year students.
