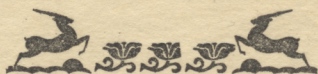

Story of the Play

Mrs. Elizabeth Chandler moves in New York's smartest circles with son, Baldwin, and daughter, Marcia. Financial difficulties lead her to think of matrimony for Baldwin and a wealthy girl. Violet Astor, an eccentric and rich young lady announces her intention of paying a visit. Mrs. Chandler determines that Baldwin and Violet shall marry and so restore the family credit. Meanwhile she is advised that Sis Perkins, poor relation from Painted Post, Missouri, is coming to New York. Mrs. Chandler writes immediately saying that the visit is impossible but Sis, bringing her pet pig, leaves the farm before Mrs. Chandler's letter arrives. The Chandlers are horrified. Further tragedy comes when Violet wires that her plans are changed and that she will be unable to come. Sis embarrasses the Chandlers with her crude untutored ways. They are delighted when Lydia La Salle, a society matron who claims to have met most celebrities, rushes in, grasps Sis's hand and insists that she is Violet Astor who she met a year ago. Mrs. Chandler realizes the lack of immediate prospects for Baldwin's wealthy marriage and contrives to have Marcia marry Count Gaston de Long. But Count de Long ignores Marcia and starts to court Sis, who is so out of place in New York that Mrs. Chandler orders her out. Sis turns the tables on her snobbish relations, proves to them that all rubes do not dwell in small towns or on farms, wins out over tremendous odds, find romance and a career in the big city. The Chandler family at last realizes that she is a generous girl whom they all learn to adore.
