

What member would not like to see the debt on our Parish Hall cancelled this Fall? That is, indeed, the goal our congregation has set for itself as an anniversary objective. To many this may seem an impossible task during these days of depression and unemployment to raise \$8,300.00, the amount owing on our Parish Hall the beginning of this year, However, if all members co-operate the goal will be reached. Hitherto many of our people have not contributed toward the Parish Hall debt fund. All should have the joy and satisfaction, though, of making a contribution. For the Parish Hall serves all our members, young and old, and is invaluable for our Sunday school work.

These members will also put their name on the envelope and the amount given will be credited to them as a subscription.
