Laurier expert alert: Summer holidays

WATERLOO – Wilfrid Laurier University has several experts available to speak about topics related to summer holidays, including the impacts of the pandemic on Canadian parks, how the natural landscapes of Ontario beaches are changing and the importance of keeping children active during the summer.

<u>Mary-Louise Byrne</u>, professor and chair in the Department of Geography and Environmental Studies, is an expert on beach and dune systems and management, particularly in protected areas surrounding the Great Lakes. Her main research sites are at Point Pelee National Park, Pinery Provincial Park, Sandbanks Provincial Park and Sauble Beach.
