THE DREAM OF A WATERLOO LUTHERAN UNIVERSITY STUDENT WILL COME TRUE TODAY
WHEN A PRICELESS COLLECTION REPRESENTING CONTEMPORARY PAINTING AND
SCULPTURE WILL GO ON DISPLAY AT THE UNIVERSITY'S RECENTLY COMPLETED
WOMEN'S RESIDENCE. ROGER DAVIDSON OF TORONTO, A STUDENT AT WATERLOO
UNIVERSITY COLLEGE, SUPPLIED THE ORIGINAL IMPETUS OF THE PROJECT AND
PERSONALLY PERSUADED THE OWNERS OF THESE MODERN WORKS OF ART TO SEND
THEM TO WATERLOO FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE STUDENTS AND THE PUBLIC OF
WATERLOO AND KITCHENER.

THE NUCLEUS OF THE SHOW IS A COLLECTION OF PAINTINGS FROM THE SAMUEL ZACKS COLLECTION OF TORONTO AND THESE HAVE AN ESTIMATED WORTH OF APPROXI-MATELY \$ 2,000,000.

SOME OF THE ARTISTS REPRESENTED IN THE SHOWING ARE JOAN AND APPEL OF THE COBRA SCHOOL, GORMAN AND HEDRICK OF THE CANADIAN SCHOOL AND KLINE AND MITCHELL OF THE AMERICAN SCHOOL; THE FRENCH, SPANISH AND ENGLISH SCHOOLS ARE ALSO INCLUDED. SCULPTURES BY HENRY MOORE AND BARBARA HEPWORTH ALSO HAVE A PROMINENT PLACE IN THE EXHIBIT.

THE SHOW WILL BE OPENED THIS EVENING IN THE RECREATION ROOM OF THE WOMEN'S RESIDENCE BY MR. ZACKS AT AN INFORMAL PRIVATE VIEWING. TOMORROW THE EXHIBIT WILL BE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC FROM 2 TO 4 IN THE AFTERNOON AND FROM 7:30 TO 9:30 IN THE EVENING. THE EXHIBIT WILL CONTINUE EVERY DAY UNTIL MARCH 13TH AT THE SAME HOURS.
