23 SUMMER SCHOLARSHIPS

AWARDED BY WLU

Twenty-three Summer Scholarships have been awarded by Waterloo Lutheran University to grade 12 and 13 students throughout Ontario.

Dr. L. H. Schaus, dean of the faculty of arts and science, said students awarded the scholarships will receive free tuition during the university's regular six-week summer school, beginning July 5. During that time the high school students can take two credit courses, selected from the list of subjects taught this year.

The scholarship program, pioneered by Waterloo Lutheran University two years ago, gives the students a chance to taste university life and get a head start on their studies.

"By completing one or two courses in a summer session, these students will be able to pursue a much fuller or enriched program of studies when they get to university," Dean Schaus explained. "They could even attempt an honors course in the first year." For example, a high school student completing a first-year history course at summer school, could attempt a second-year honors course during his first year at university.

The scholarship winners will mingle with the expected 1,500 other students who will be attending summer school at the WLU campus. Courses are offered in a wide variety of subjects, including English, French, German, philosophy, psychology, Russian, sociology and Spanish.

A student winning a scholarship during his Grade 12 year could win another during his Grade 13 year, thus piling up four full credits before entering university. All students selected have a minimum average of 75 per cent and are nominated by the principal and guidance department on the basis of their year's work.
