WLU PHILOSOPHY STUDENT WINS

WOODROW WILSON FELLOWSHIP

Harry Alexander Beatty, 19, an honors philosophy student at Waterloo Lutheran University, is one of 95 Canadian university students winning a first-year study fellowship from the Woodrow Wilson Fellowship Foundation.

A second Waterloo Lutheran student, John Greenall of Thorold, an honors geography student, won honorable mention.

Mr. Beatty wins \$2,000 plus free tuition at any graduate school in Canada or the United States. It is expected that the Waterloo Lutheran winner, like the others, will pursue a career as a college teacher.

Sir Hugh Taylor, president of the foundation, said, "These able young men and women represent the best in Canadian undergraduate scholarship. When they have completed their graduate studies we expect to find them teaching in Canadian university classrooms."

Harry Beatty first came to WLU in 1963 as a summer scholarship winner at the end of his grade 13 year. He took two courses during the six-week summer session, philosophy and history, then enrolled at the university in the fall.

By continuing taking summer courses, he completed his four-year honors course in three years. In the 1963-64 year, he was included on the dean's honors lists of outstanding students.
