DOCTOR AND WIFE WILL SERVE

MENNONITE MISSION IN GHANA

A young husband and wife medical missionary team from the Kitchener-Waterloo area left Canada this month for a three-year term of service in Ghana, West Africa. Dr. James H. Snider and Mrs. Janice Snider will serve the Mennonite mission.

Dr. Snider, son of Mr. & Mrs. Stanley Snider, Kitchener, graduated from Rockway Mennonite High School in 1954 and later attended Waterloo University College. In 1962 he received his M.D. degree from University of Western Ontario, London.

Mrs. Snider, the former Janice Lambke of Preston, graduated from Stratford Teachers College and taught elementary school in the South Waterloo and London areas.

Besides medical work, Dr. Snider will act as general contractor for the building of a hospital at Somania, Ghana, and will preach in three area churches. The most prevalent illnesses in the area are tuberculosis, malaria and parasitic diseases.

The Mennonite mission in Ghana was founded in 1956. Before leaving Canada, Dr. Snider said that the medical work was meant to be a means of building this Church in Ghana. He also hoped to develop medical education for the people of the country in the near future.
