THREE ALUMNI AMONG FOUR NEW

FACULTY APPOINTED TO WUC

Three alumni are among four new faculty members whose appointments are announced by Dr. Lloyd H. Schaus, dean of Waterloo University College, the arts faculty of Waterloo Lutheran University. They are the first new faculty appointments announced by the university for the coming academic year.

Lorne H. Russwurm, a native of Mildmay, Ontario, has been named a lecturer in geography. A graduate of Waterloo University College in 1957, Mr. Russwurm gained his M.A. in geography from the University of Western Ontario in 1961, and is now completing his Ph.D. program in geography at the University of Illinois. His experience includes secondary school teaching and summer work with the geographical branch of the Federal Government on map-making expeditions.

winner of the WUC University Gold Medal in 1963, Richard Albert Mende, of Kitchener, has been appointed a lecturer in English. He graduated from WUC in 1963 with first class honours in English and philosophy, and is due to receive his M.A. in English from the University of Illinois in June.

Priscilla Mary Yantha, now completing her M.A. in English at the University of Toronto, will become a lecturer in English. Miss Yantha, who was born in Timmins, Ontario, graduated from WUC in 1963.
