WLU ALUMNI TO RAISE \$17,500

FOR NEW UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

The Alumni Association of Waterloo Lutheran University plans to raise \$17,500 toward the new university library, it was reported today (Saturday) by Bev. L. Hayes, of Waterloo, Alumni Loyalty Fund chairman. The goal was approved at the association's annual business meeting during the university's Homecoming Weekend.

In kicking off the Second Annual Alumni Loyalty Fund, Mr. Hayes also announced the successful completion of the WLU Alumni's first campaign to raise \$11,500. Main objective of that drive, a Steinway concert grand piano, was presented by Mr. Hayes and retiring alumni president Pablo Machetzki, of Waterloo, to university president Dr. William J. Villaume at a concert Friday night. This concert featured internationally-known Israeli pianist Daniel Barenboim.

Main goal of the 1964-65 campaign is \$15,000 for the completion of the foyer, entrance and display area of the library. First payment of \$2,000 on a five year \$10,000 pledge by the Class of 1964 toward a library seminar room is also included, as are funds for the alumni scholarship and gold medals to top graduating honours students. Construction of the new WLU library is expected to start at the end of November.
