Cage Hawks Win 40th Straight

WLU HAWKS SPLIT ON WEEKEND

The Waterloo Lutheran University GOLDEN HAWKS hockey team after losing 7-0 to a strong U. of Waterloo team Thursday, in an exhibition game, travel to Michigan this weekend.

They play two exhibition games against the University of Michigan, Friday and Saturday night.

On Tuesday, Dec. 6 the hockey HAWKS host the U. of Waterloo WARRIORS at the Kitchener Memorial Auditorium and will be out to seek revenge for the trouncing of last week.

The HAWKS are undefeated in league play to date with decisive victories over Ryerson and Osgoode Hall.

The basketball GOLDEN HAWKS defending Ontario Intercollegiate Athletic Association basketball champions, won their 40th consecutive league game Friday as they defeated the Western Ontario Institute of Technology 82-36, in a game played in Windsor.

Their unbeaten string is over a period of three seasons.

The HAWKS completely dominated the game Friday but were only ahead 34-19 at half time. A strong second half enabled the HAWKS to outscore their hosts 43 to 17.

Dave Cox and John Zdrahal lead the HAWKS scoring with 16 points each, followed by freshman Bob Bain with 11 and Norm Cuttiford with 9.

Every member of the GOLDEN HAWKS team managed to hit the score sheet.

Last season the GOLDEN HAWKS defeated the University of Windsor LANCERS 89-74, the only defeat the LANCERS suffered at the hands of a Canadian team.

However, last Saturday night the LANCERS trounced the GOLDEN HAWKS 106-47 in an exhibition game played in Windsor.

The LANCERS always strong basketball opposition, displayed their veteran superiority over the relatively inexperienced WLU team.

The HAWKS miss the service of Bill Gillespie, out due to health reasons, and Glenn Wilke, out with a knee injury. Pete Misikowetz is sitting out the year due to inelligibility. All three were first string players on last season's conference champions.

Freshman Sandy Nixon scored 16 points, while John Zdrahal added another 8.

Veteran players lead the LANCERS in scoring. Angelo Mazzuchin was high scorer with 25 points, followed by Marty Kwiatkowski, Bob Navetta and Doug Brown with 18, 17, 12 points respectively.

The LANCERS lead 64-27 at half time.

The HAWKS play two exhibition games at home this week. On Wednesday, Nov. 30 they host the McMaster MARAUDERS, and then the University of Waterloo WARRIORS on Saturday, Dec. 3.

Both games will be played at 8 p.m. in the Theatre Auditorium.
