Grants Aid 5 On Faculty

<u>In Further Professional Study</u>

Five members of the faculty of Waterloo Lutheran University recently received grants for further professional study.

Prof. Raymond Koenig, chairman of the department of physics, has been awarded a summer study grant in the amount of \$1,020 by the board of college education of the Lutheran Church in America for study toward his doctorate at York University.

Prof. Robert Langen, associate professor of philosophy, will study art in a special six-week summer program at the University of Oslo, Norway, Prof. Langen is chairman of the subcommittee on art for the campus cultural affairs committee. The grant was made to him by the LCA's board of college education.

Dr. Terence Scully, assistant professor of romance languages, has been awarded a Canada Council grant of \$1,000 to assist him in the study and publication of a medieval French poem contained in a manuscript in the Bibliotheque Nationale, Paris.

Prof, James Kitchen, assistant professor of economics, was awarded a \$750 study grant by the LCA's board of college education for work toward his doctorate at the University of Michigan.

Prof. Delton Glebe, associate professor of practical theology, will be on leave for part of next year, continuing work in a doctoral program at Knox College, University of Toronto. The LCA's board of theological education provided a grant of \$2,000 to assist Prof. Glebe.
