<u>Game of the Decade Highlight of Homecoming '67:</u>

Golden Hawks and Warriors Meet

Homecoming '67 will have the athletic activities focused on Seagram Stadium Saturday afternoon when the Waterloo Lutheran University Golden Hawks and the University of Waterloo Warriors meet in a Central Canada Intercollegiate Football Conference game before an expected large crowd of homecoming fans,

The Golden Hawks, currently tied for top spot in the C.C.I.F.C. with McMaster University Marauders, will be looking for their fifth straight win in the 1967 schedule. The Warriors will be after their third win of the campaign, having suffered losses to Carleton and McMaster.

Rivalry always runs high when the Hawks and the Warriors meet.

Saturday's game will be the sixth time these two schools have met. The first three games, 1962-1964, ended in a one point difference.

In 1962 the Hawks won 7-6 and then lost 13-12 in 1963, and then were victorious in the next three games. In 1964 they edged out the Warriors on a 19-18 score and the following year toppled the Warriors with a 29-8 win. Last year the Hawks soured the U of W homecoming with a 17-7 margin for the victory.

Saturday's game will be the last regular league game in which the Hawks and the Warriors will meet. Next season the Warriors and the McMaster Marauders will play in the Ontario-Quebec Athletic Association conference.

John Kruspe continues to lead the Hawk's scoring attack. The sophomore halfback from Clifford scored 12 points in last Saturday's 56-0 win over Bishops University Gaiters to boost his total scoring points to 52 in four league games. Kruspe has scored six touchdowns, completed fourteen of 21 convert attempts and has booted two singles. Doug Strong has scored 18 points on three majors.

Saturday's game plans to be the best football game that the faculty and students of both universities have seen, between the two clubs.

Both teams appear to be in excellent physical condition as they prepare for the annual battle of "Waterloos." Game time at Seagram Stadium is 1:30.
