Hockey and Cage Hawks on the Road

For Six Games

Varsity basketball and hockey teams at Waterloo Lutheran University will be on the road for the next six games.

The hockey Hawks fresh from an Ontario Intercollegiate Athletic Association league win in Windsor last Saturday have a two game road trip. The Hawks with a 4-1 won-lost record by virtue of their 5-2 win over the University of Windsor Lancers last Saturday travel to St. Catharines this Thursday, Jan. 11 for a league game with Brock University Generals.

In their previous encounter the Hawks trounced the Generals 7-3.

Following Thursday's game the Hawks travel to Sudbury for an O.I.A.A. league game with Laurentian University Voyageurs. The Voyageurs were last year's O.I.A.A. champions with the Hawks finishing second • Sunday's game in Sudbury may well be the most important game the Hawks will face this season.

The Voyageurs pay a return visit to the WLU campus for Winter Carnival weekend at the end of January.

Centre John O'Flaherty, the Hawk's most valuable player for the past two seasons missed Saturday's game against Windsor due to a torn tendon in his right leg but is expected to play in Thursday's game against Brock.

Meanwhile the basketball Hawks will be looking for a win as they take to the road in a four game road trip.

On Wednesday, Jan. 10 the Hawks travel to London for a non-conference game with the University of Western Ontario Mustangs and will be looking for a win after the Mustangs took an 84-77 decision from the Hawks last Saturday.

The cage Hawks with a 4-5 won-lost record swing back into O.I.A.A. league action when they play York University Windigoes in Toronto on Saturday Jan. 13. The Hawks have played only one league game to date and that was a 88-65 win over the same York team.

The defending Ontario Intercollegiate Athletic Association basketball champion Hawks then have conference games with Ryerson Rams on Tuesday, Jan. 18 and Osgoode Hall Owls on Friday, Jan. 19 in Toronto.

The next home game for the Hawks is Saturday, Jan. 20 when the University of Toronto visits WLU for a non-conference game.
