Two Administrative Posts

## Filled at University

Two men, one an alumnus of Waterloo Lutheran University and the other a navy veteran, have been appointed to administrative posts at the university.

Colin McKay, executive director of the Mountain Family YMCA in Hamilton, and a 1953 WLU graduate, becomes director of educational services.

James Johnson, formerly with the Canadian navy, is the new director of placement and student aid. He replaces Robert Wagner, who is retiring.

Mr. McKay received a B.A. degree from WLU in 1953 and has taken additional courses at the university and at Sir George Williams University, Montreal.

He joined the Kitchener-Waterloo YMCA in 1953 and became adult program secretary before accepting the position of metro program secretary with the Montreal YMCA in 1962. He has been the senior secretary at the Hamilton Mountain YMCA since 1966.

Mr. Johnson comes to WLU from the University of Victoria, B.C., where he has taught a course in industrial psychology and advised students on vocational matters. Seventeen years with the navy, he served as personnel selection officer and supervisor for officer training courses.

At WLU, he will advise students on loans and bursaries and assist them in selecting part-time jobs and post-degree employment. Part of his duties will consist of vocational testing and guidance.
