Five Students of German  
will Spend Summer in Europe

Five students majoring in German at Waterloo Lutheran University will spend the summer in Germany.

They are Linda Witt of Brantford, Helene Seutter and Ursula Ploetner, both of Kitchener; and Lora Sadtke and John Routley, both of Waterloo.

They will study and work in a program arranged through the Canadian German Academic Exchange Association and the German Embassy in Canada.

Dr. Klaus Bongart, WLU assistant professor of German, guided the numerous applications for study scholarships as well as work and travel opportunities. He said the program is valuable in helping students to perfect their proficiency in the German language and experience German culture and life at first hand.

Miss Ploetner, who speaks German fluently, will work as a waitress in the town of Pforzheim, near Heidelberg. Miss Witt will attend the famous Goethe Institute near Munich for eight weeks.

The others, Miss Seutter, Miss Sadtke and Mr. Routley, have received scholarships and will enroll in six-week credit courses at the University of Kiel, near Hamburg. All five will have an opportunity for a month's travel throughout Germany and Europe.
