## Golden Hawks Surprise Windsor

## Down O.Q.A.A. leaders 53-46

No victory could have been more pleasing to Coach Howard Lockhart than the 53-46 win posted by his Waterloo Lutheran University Golden Hawks over the University of Windsor Lancers.

Windsor, undefeated leaders of the Ontario-Quebec Athletic Association, are again the class of their conference this season and were expected to be more than the rebuilding Hawks could handle.

WLU until this game had lost five straight non-conference games, two of which were to O.Q.A.A. teams and were experiencing the many agonies that strike any team that is forced to undergo a major rebuilding year.

This same Windsor team had defeated the Golden Hawks 92-67 earlier this season and few observers gave the young Waterloo club much of a chance.

However, as usual, Coach Lockhart has done a remarkable job in such a short space of time. With three big positions to fill alongside returning guards Sandy Nixon and Bob Bain, the WLU Coach has brought newcomers Chris Coulthard, Wally Escott, Doug Bain and Mike Moffat along to the point where they could hold the high flying Lancer squad to a mere fourteen points in one full 20 minutes of play.

Both WLU and windsor were tied 32-32 at the half of this very exciting game. The Hawks opened up leads of 7 points twice in the first 20 minutes but were unable to hold off the fast breaking Lancers to gain any real advantage.

In the last period WLU employed good sound ball control to keep Windsor away from the basket. As time began to run out the Lancers, forced to play catch up ball, became disorganized and their shooting became very ineffective as they never had the opportunity to get set.

Sandy Nixon played another great offensive and defensive game for WLU and he along with Wally Escott ran up fourteen points for the winners. The top scorer for the University of Windsor team was Andy Auch with 13 points.
