WLU Hosting County Meeting April 1

of Business and Commerce Teachers

Business and commerce teachers and commercial directors from Conestoga College and Waterloo County Secondary schools will confer with their associates at the School of Business and Economics, Waterloo Lutheran University, on Wednesday.

The get-together will be the fourth this year between Waterloo Lutheran faculty members and teachers in the county.

More than 60 teachers are expected for Wednesday's event, beginning at 7:30 p.m. It will feature a tour of the university's business school, followed by work sessions on accounting, data processing, economics and marketing.

Henry H. Dueck, WLU registrar, said the meeting should lead to a fuller understanding of the courses at each school. Curriculum content and material at all the institutions will be discussed.

"We think there can be great gains for the students if the curriculum at the schools are understood so that overlapping can be avoided," Mr. Dueck said. "It will also ease the path for students transferring from the community college to the university and the reverse. The important thing is to find the best way to meet students needs."

Mr. Dueck said other successful meetings had been held earlier this year at the university with secondary school teachers of science, languages, history and geography.

Endorsement of the meetings has come from Ralph Hodd, superintendent of planning and development for the Waterloo County Board of Education, who also saw the need for discussion and co-ordination between instructors at the secondary school and university level.

"We think the meetings held so far have been productive and are extremely pleased with Mr. Hodd's support and the enthusiasm of teachers in the county," Mr. Dueck said.

Playing a key role in this week's meeting are Armand Klinck, Commercial Co-ordinator for the Waterloo County Board of Education; Prof. Glenn Carroll, dean of the WLU School of Business and Economics; and Douglas Austin, Chairman of business and commerce at Conestoga College.
