<u>Leading Archaeologist to Speak</u>

at WLU on Canadian Pre-history

Dr. J.V. Wright, senior archaeologist at Ottawa's National Museum of Man, will give an illustrated talk Thursday at Waterloo Lutheran University covering the little-known and fascinating field of Canada's 13,000 years of pre-history.

His talk is sponsored by the WLU Cultural Affairs Committee and will be presented in Room 1E1 of the Arts Building at 3:30 p.m. The public is invited.

Dr. Wright, often called. Canada's "Mr. Archaeology," has completed research that has helped revolutionize the field and is author of the recent book Ontario Iroquois Tradition. He has taken leading roles in major archaeological digs throughout North America.

Dr. Wright's lecture will be of particular interest to the WLU community with its involvement in anthropology and archaeology and with its ongoing excavation work at an Indian village site in the county, which involves many WLU students.
