Named New Dean at WLU

Dr. Gerald Vallillee, dean of arts and science at Laurentian University, Sudbury, will take over the same office at Waterloo Lutheran University July 1, it has been announced by Dr. P. Basil Healey, academic vice-president.

He succeeds Dr. Neale Taylor who will become the university's academic vice-president, replacing Dr. Healey, who is returning to teaching and research in the School of Business and Economics.

Dr. Vallillee, former head of the classics department at Laurentian, has taught more than 20 years at the university level. He was 10 years at McGill University and then served for shorter periods at Bishop's University and the University of Ottawa, before joining the Laurentian faculty 11 years ago.

He took his B.A. at McGill University in 1950 with first class honours in Greek and Latin. Three years later he completed an M.A. at the same University, then completed his work for a Ph.D. from the University of Chicago in 1960.

He was born October 6, 1921 in Buckingham, Quebec, and is fluently bilingual. During his years as a student he won many scholastic awards, including the Henry Chapman Gold Medal in Classics at McGill.
