There are 21 of these stations now, located in the congested districts of this city, and ours, at Chicago Commons, is one of the largest. It costs \$2,000 to run this station for a year:

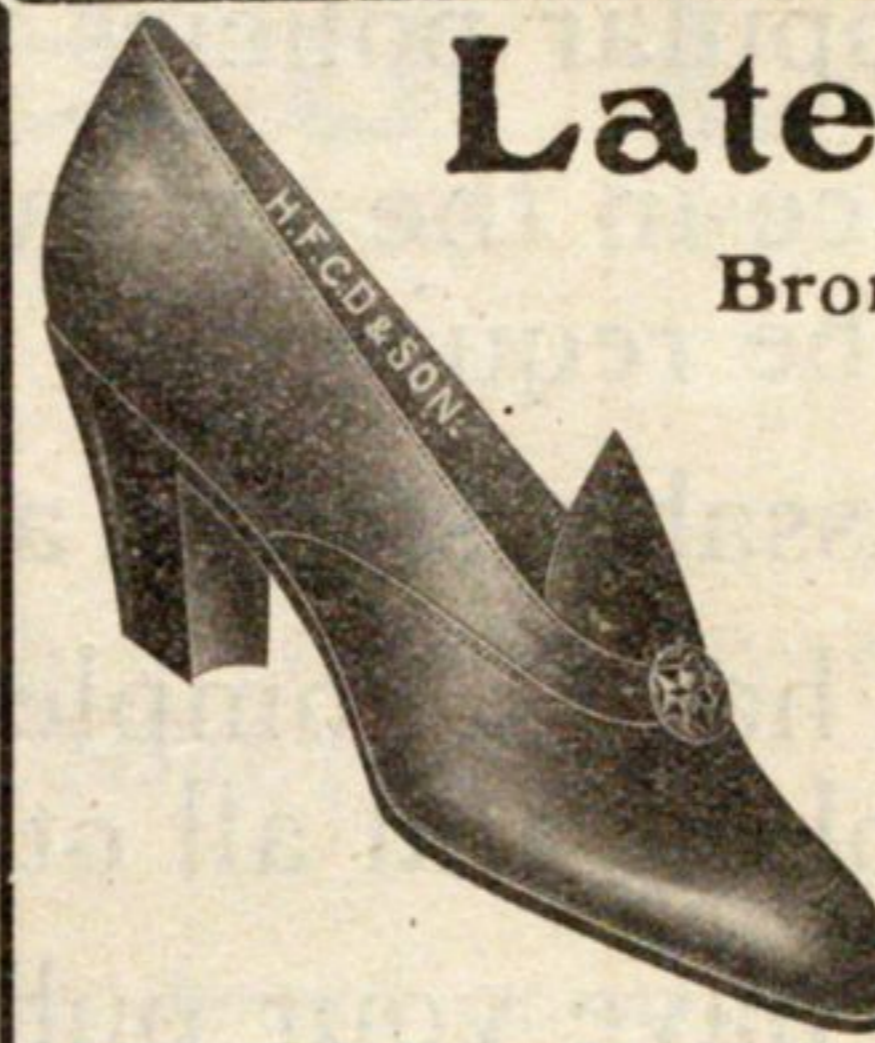
