NORTH SHORE JUVENILE ASSOCIATION STOP WORK

War Conditions Cause Temporary Suspension of Active Labors—Will Likely Invest Funds.

The fifth annual meeting of the Juvenile Protective Association of the North Shore was held Tuesday evening, April 3, at Community house, Winnetka. The treasurer reported a balance on hand of \$230.40. It was resolved that in view of the exceptional demands to be anticipated upon both time and purses of the members of the organization, consequent upon the war, the work of the organization be temporarily suspended until otherwise directed by special meeting of member to be called by the officers whenever, in their judgment, public conditions warrant resumption of work; that in the meantime no funds should be solicited, but that the funds on hand (\$230.40) be held intact pending action looking to resumption of work, or the actual dissolution of the organization, as may hereinafter be determined upon at a special meeting of the members.

Under the circumstances it was thought desirable not to attempt to elect new officers, but to allow the old officers to hold over for want of successors. The executive officers were authorized to place the present funds of the organization at interest, or to loan them without interest to some other charitable organization, as in their judgment they might deem best.
