

## New Trier Girls Will Present Fairy Pageant at High School

THE physical training department for girls at the New Trier High school will present a pageant on June 8 in the high school gymnasium. The story part of the pageant, "A Dream Fantasy" was written by Miss Helen Hootman, physical director of the high school girls.

Miss Margaret Tozier, assistant physical director, will assist Miss Hootman in training the 200 members of the girls' department who will take part in the dances. Twelve original dances will feature the program with a group of well known dances worked in with the special numbers.

### Story of Pageant.

The music will be under the direction of Mr. Homer Cotton. Costumes and an indirect lighting system for the presentation which will be held indoors on account of the bad weather prevalent in this community for the past several weeks, are features being arranged by the directors.

The story begins with an Earth Child playing with a bird in a garden, the child falls asleep and wakes up to find herself in the land of dreams playing with the elves. The elves bring the Spirit of Dreams to see the Earth Child and she conducts her on a tour through the night.

They wander in the Land of the

Elves, see Dewdrops, Fire Flies, Shadows, and Wood Nymphs. The Stars then take charge of the Earth Child and takes her to the throne of the Queen of Night and the Goddess of the Moon. At the throne of the Goddess they find the Spirits of flowers and dreams.

Winnetka, Ill., May 18, 1917. Notice is hereby given that the contract for the construction of the following improvement:

A connected system of vitrified tile pipe and reinforced Portland cement concrete pipe storm sewers, including Portland cement concrete manholes, Portland cement concrete catch basins with connections, cast iron pipe sewer outlet, combined outlet and spillway of reinforced Portland cement concrete, vitrified tile pipe junctions closed with discs, vitrified tile pipe slants closed with discs, reinforced Portland cement concrete headwall, Portland cement concrete plugs for closing present catch basin connections, said back-filling under brick and concrete pavements, together with the adjusting and connecting of present street catch basins, the adjusting and connecting of present sewers, the adjusting of supports of present sewer outlet in Elder Lane, the removal of unused portions of said present sewer outlet, the restoration of pavements and the removal of all surplus excavated materials, to be constructed in the following named streets, avenues and public ways, to-wit:

In Elder Lane and Elder Lane extended from and discharging into Lake Michigan at a point four hundred seventy (470) feet easterly from the easterly line extended of Sheridan Road to the easterly line extended of Wilson Street; also in Sheridan Road, Winnetka Avenue, Willow Street, Hawthorn Lane, Fairview Avenue, Woodland Avenue, Fir Street, Public Pathway in Trier Center Neighborhood, Hill Road, Myrtle Street, Sunset Road, Essex Road, Warwick Avenue, Elson Street and Poplar Street, in the Village of Winnetka, County of Cook and State of Illinois, said improvement being otherwise known as General Number 326,741 in the Superior Court of Cook County, was awarded on the 12th day of May, 1917, to Robert Shannon, Joliet, Illinois, for the sum of Sixty-eight Thousand One Hundred Sixty-two and 20/100 Dollars (\$68,162.20).

#### CALL FOR BIDS

Winnetka, Ill., May 18, 1917. Notice is hereby given that sealed bids for the construction of the following improvement of Cherry Street:

The construction of a Portland cement concrete sidewalk five (5) feet four (4) inches in width, five (5) inches thick at the center and four (4) inches thick at the edges, laid on six inches of cinders, said improvement to include all grading, embankments and filling, on the south side of Cherry Street from the west curb line of Locust Street to the west line extended of lot six (6), block nine (9) of Groveland Subdivision, said improvement and assessment being otherwise known as Winnetka Special Assessment No. 249 in accordance with the ordinance heretofore passed therefor, will be received by the Board of Local Improvements of the Village of Winnetka by or before 8 o'clock p. m., on Tuesday, the 29th day of May, A. D. 1917, at which hour all bids will be opened at a meeting to be held in the Council Chambers of the Village Hall in the said Village of Winnetka, Cook County, Illinois.

The specifications of said improvements are on file in the office of the Clerk of said Village of Winnetka.

Contractors will be paid in bonds bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per cent per annum for all estimates approved by the Board of Local Improvements, in the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars and over and when the amount of balance due on any estimate is less than the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, the same will be paid by time warrants. In addition to the usual bond for construction and maintenance in the sum equal to the amount of the bid accepted by the Board of Local Improvements, the successful bidder will be required to furnish an indemnity and defense policy in some reliable company, indemnifying the Village of Winnetka against loss from liability for damages on account of injury or death suffered by reason of the performance of the work required to be performed by the said contractor,

by any person or persons, including such liability imposed under the employers' liability and workmen's compensation law of the State of Illinois, and the amendments thereof, in the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars.

# PROCLAMATION

## Dogs must be Muzzled

Whereas, a number of persons in Winnetka have recently been bitten by dogs and a number of cases of rabies have been reported in this vicinity, and

Whereas, it is the judgment of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Winnetka that it is necessary for the safety of the inhabitants of said Village that all dogs running at large in said village shall be muzzled, and

Whereas, the Trustees of the Village of Winnetka by resolution passed on March 20, 1917, have instructed the Village President to issue a proclamation in accordance with Section 204 of Chapter 14 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Winnetka;

I therefore declare from the first day of June until the last day of September, 1917, all dogs found running at large within the Village of Winnetka shall be subject to the penalties provided in Chapter 14 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Winnetka, unless such dogs are securely muzzled.
