

**VILLAGE OF WINNETKA
SPECIAL ASSESSMENT NOTICE**

**Winnetka Special Assessment
Number 269.**

In the County Court of Cook County, Illinois.

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that the Village of Winnetka, Cook County, Illinois, having ordered a supplemental special assessment to pay the estimated deficiency in the cost of the work and interest for the construction of a local improvement in the Village of Winnetka, County of Cook and State of Illinois, the ordinance for which said improvement provided as follows, to-wit: That Sheridan Road for a width of thirty-one (31) feet, from the north line extended of North Avenue to the south limits of the Village of Winnetka, including the roadways of all street intersections and returns as far back as the street lines of Sheridan Road extended and the street returns and roadway intersections at the intersection of Walnut Street and Spruce Street (lying west of Sheridan Road) with Sheridan Road, as far back as the west line, extended of Walnut Street and as far back as the south line extended of Spruce Street, except the return at Park Street and Sheridan Road, and the return at Cherry Street lying east of the proposed east curb line of Sheridan Road, be improved by excavating, grading, draining, preparing sub-grade, constructing and connecting new catch basins, furnishing and placing new manhole covers, refilling abandoned catch basins, adjusting present manhole covers, furnishing and placing new water gate valve box tops, constructing new return curbs on six (6) inches of crushed limestone and paving with steel reinforced Portland cement two course concrete with integral curb and steel protected asphaltic felt joints, curing and protecting the same, adjusting present concrete walk approaches, constructing new concrete walk approaches, including all labor and materials, all in the Village of Winnetka, County of Cook and State of Illinois, and which said ordinance was passed and approved by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Winnetka, Cook County, Illinois, on the sixteenth day of May, A. D. 1916, and

which special assessment proceeding was known as Winnetka Special Assessment Number 243, in the County Court of Cook County, Illinois, the ordinance for the same being on file in the office of the Village Clerk of said village, and the said village having applied to the County Court of Cook County, Illinois, for a supplemental special assessment to pay the estimated deficiency in the cost of the work and interest of said Local Improvement, according to the benefits, and a supplemental special assessment therefor having been made and returned to said Court, Docket Number 269, the final hearing thereon will be held on the tenth day of September, A. D. 1917, or as soon thereafter as the business of the said Court will permit. All persons desiring may file objections in said Court before said day, and may appear on the hearing and make their defense. Said ordinance provides for the collection of said supplemental special assessment in ten (10) annual installments with interest thereon at the rate of five per centum (5%) per annum.

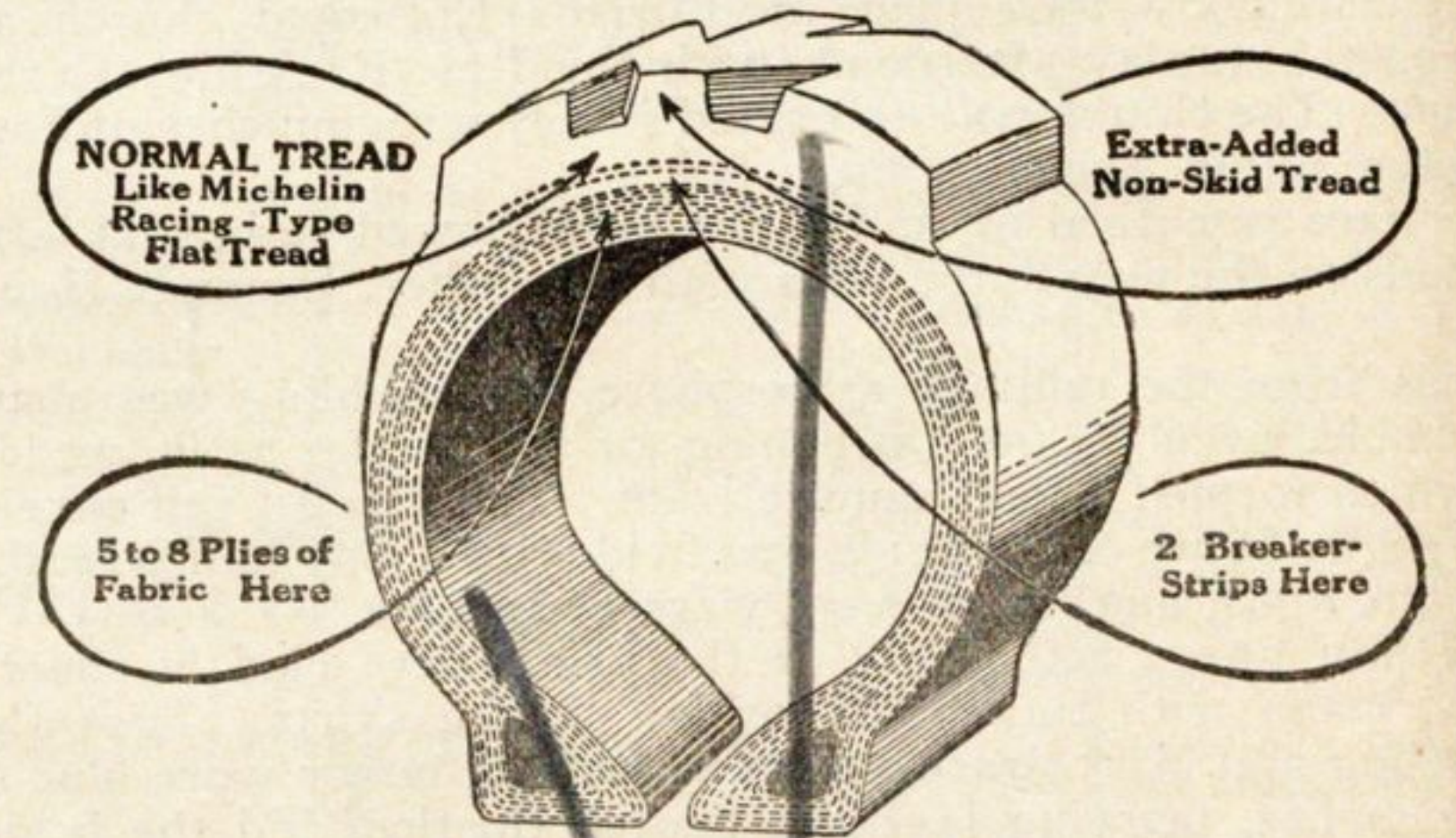

Notice of Special Election

Notice is hereby given that a SPECIAL ELECTION is to be held in the VILLAGE OF WINNETKA on **TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 25TH, 1917**, for the purpose of VOTING for the following officers: **Candidates to fill a vacancy in the office of Treasurer for the Village of Winnetka.**

That for the purpose of holding said election the Village of Winnetka shall be divided into four election districts or precincts as follows:

PRECINCT NO. 1—Shall be bounded on the north by the north limits of the Village, on the east by Lake Michigan, on the south by the center line of North Avenue, and on the west by the westerly limits of the Village.

That the office occupied by C. T. Northrop, located at 1065 Gage Street, in the Village of Winnetka, is hereby designated as the polling place in PRECINCT No. 1, for the purpose of holding said election.

PRECINCT NO. 2—Shall be bounded on the north by the center line of North Avenue, on the east by Lake Michigan, on the south by the center line of Elm Street, and on the west by the westerly limits of the Village.

That the office occupied by Byron Nelson, at 806 Elm Street, in the Village of Winnetka is hereby designated as the polling place in PRECINCT No. 2, for the purpose of holding said election.

PRECINCT NO. 3—Shall be bounded on the north by the center line of Elm Street, on the east by Lake Michigan, on the south by the center line of Willow Street, and on the west by the westerly limits of the Village.

That the Store formerly occupied by Winnetka Weekly Talk, at Number 22 Prouty Court, between Elm and Oak Streets, is hereby designated as the polling place in PRECINCT No. 3, for the purpose of holding said election.

PRECINCT NO. 4—Shall be bounded on the north by the center line of Willow Street, on the east by Lake Michigan, on the south by the southerly limits of the Village, and on the west by the westerly limits of the Village.

That the Store known as Indian Hill Inn, located on Winnetka Avenue, near Wilson Street, in the Village of Winnetka, is hereby designated as the polling place in PRECINCT No. 4, for the purpose of holding said election.

That for the purpose of said election the polls shall be open at the respective polling places above mentioned at the hour of 6 o'clock A. M. and shall remain open from such hour until the hour of 6 o'clock P. M. on the said 25th day of September, 1917.
