The market at the present time is flooded with auxiliary air and moisture injecting devices, some of which there is no time to lose." are good and some bad. The moisture injecting devices will in most cases prevent the formation of carbon on the cylinder walls, but they are not likely to remove carbon already formed, although this claim is made for them. The air devices are practically useless, unless the owner is absolutely certain that the air range of his carburetor is insufficient. If the adjustment already on the carburetor is capable of supplying more air an auxiliary air device is a waste of money.
