U. OF C. MAN WILL TALK HERE FOR SUNDAY CLUB

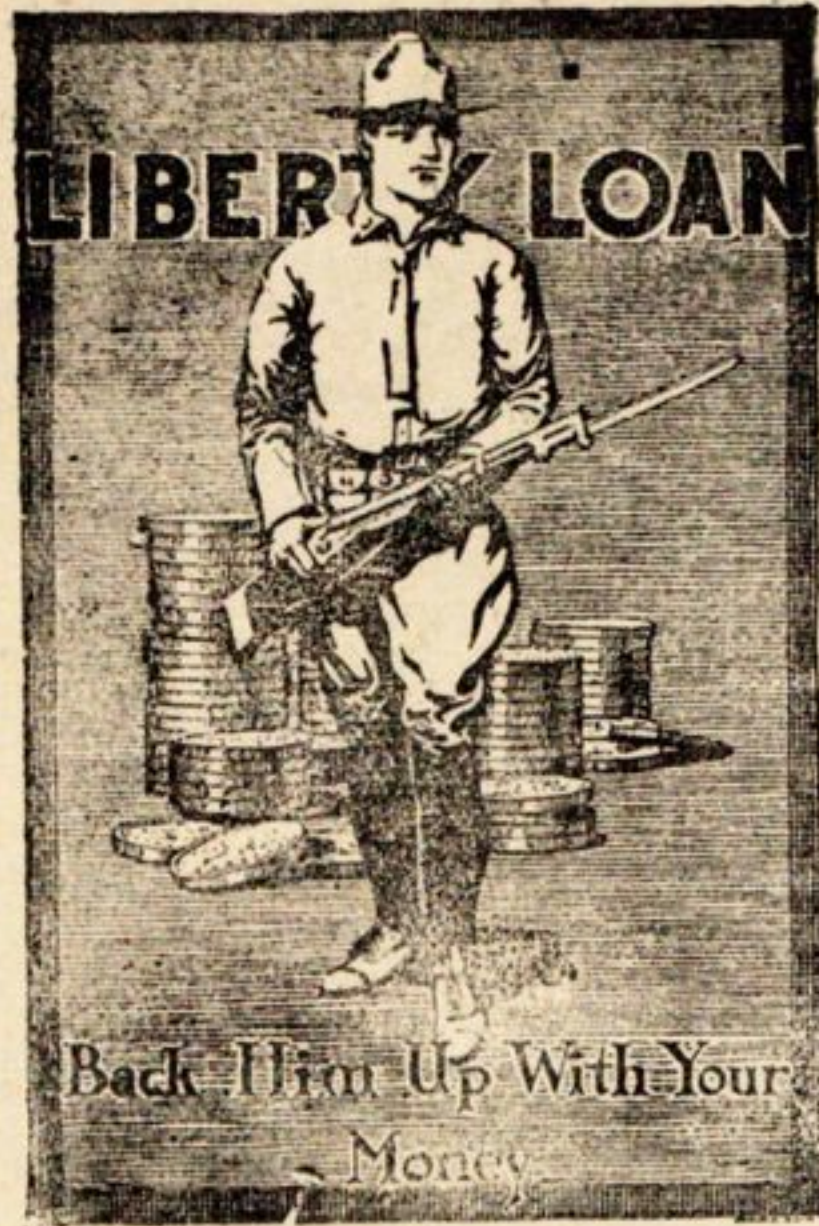

to the fact that they may vote on this bond issue."

Lake County Issues \$500,000.

A \$500,000 county bond issue will be submitted to the voters of Lake county at the coming election to be held Oct. 30. The money, if the bond issue is approved, is to be used to meet that county's share of the cost of building the Chicago to Milwaukee Post road—an inland road running north from the north end of Lincoln avenue in Chicago and crossing the Deerfield road near Deerfield to a point west of Waukegan, thence east to Waukegan and north on Sheridan road to the county line, also in part reconstructing the east and west roads through the county, and the road as its eastern terminus.

The federal and state authorities have appropriated \$400,000 to aid Cook and Lake counties in building the Chicago to Milwaukee Post road. By agreement between the Cook and Lake county roads and bridges committee, Lake county is to have \$325,000 of this and Cook county only \$75,000. Lake county will lose this fund unless it provides the balance of approximately \$200,000 to build its portion of this road. It has no way to raise this money except through a bond issue. By making the issue \$500,000 it can also build the road west from Waukegan through the county. One-half the cost of this east and west road will be returned to the county out of state aid funds or out of the \$60,000,000 state-wide bond issue, approved by the last legislature and to be voted on at the November, 1916, general election.

Roads of Concrete.

These two roads are to be built of concrete—permanent, all-the-year-around roads. The Post road will serve the immense traffic from Chicago and Waukegan to Fort Sheridan and Great Lakes Training station, both of which are so sadly in need of a usable hard road.

A vote for this bond issue means accepting the federal-state gift of \$200,000; a vote against means forfeiting it. A vote for it means a patriotic vote for a grave traffic necessity. A vote for it is good business for the county, in getting two of its most important roads permanently improved now, with the county paying less than half of the cost. Cook county, which passed a \$2,000,000 road bond issue two years ago, is submitting another \$1,000,000 bond issue to supplement the Lake county \$500,000 issue. Will Lake county fail to do its bit for the county, the state and the federal government?

patois has brought out many confidences today.

I dressed a cut finger this morning. This afternoon, as I was standing talking with a group of people, I felt a little hand slip into mine. The child stayed with me for an hour. I wish we could fit up a playground for them—to keep them at play. A French woman teaches them, and at recess the children all sit on the ground and receive a piece of black bread. I am writing home for some cereals, the lack of them is very manifest—so many children in the infirmary with digestive disturbances. Tell Polly King to have the Red Cross girls make children's clothes.

This morning it was foggy and very cool. I do not know what we will do when it is winter—fuel is bound to be scarce. Germany holds all the coal lands of France.

At noon, when the sun was high, it was beautiful and warm, though hazy in the distance. We are on a very high hill and see hills all around us. Two Johns Hopkins physicians from their unit called on us today and had lunch with us.
