broken glass. While I was buying some oilcloth, the siren rang, which meant for everyone to disappear. down in the caves. Miss Mwho is one of our drivers, and I, were taken by our hostess of the store into an old wine cellar, which had been furnished with a bed for her children, two chaise lounges and some stools. There were twelve of us in the cave; we had no sooner reached there than the guns began firing their high explosives. It takes eleven men to fire one shot at the avions.
