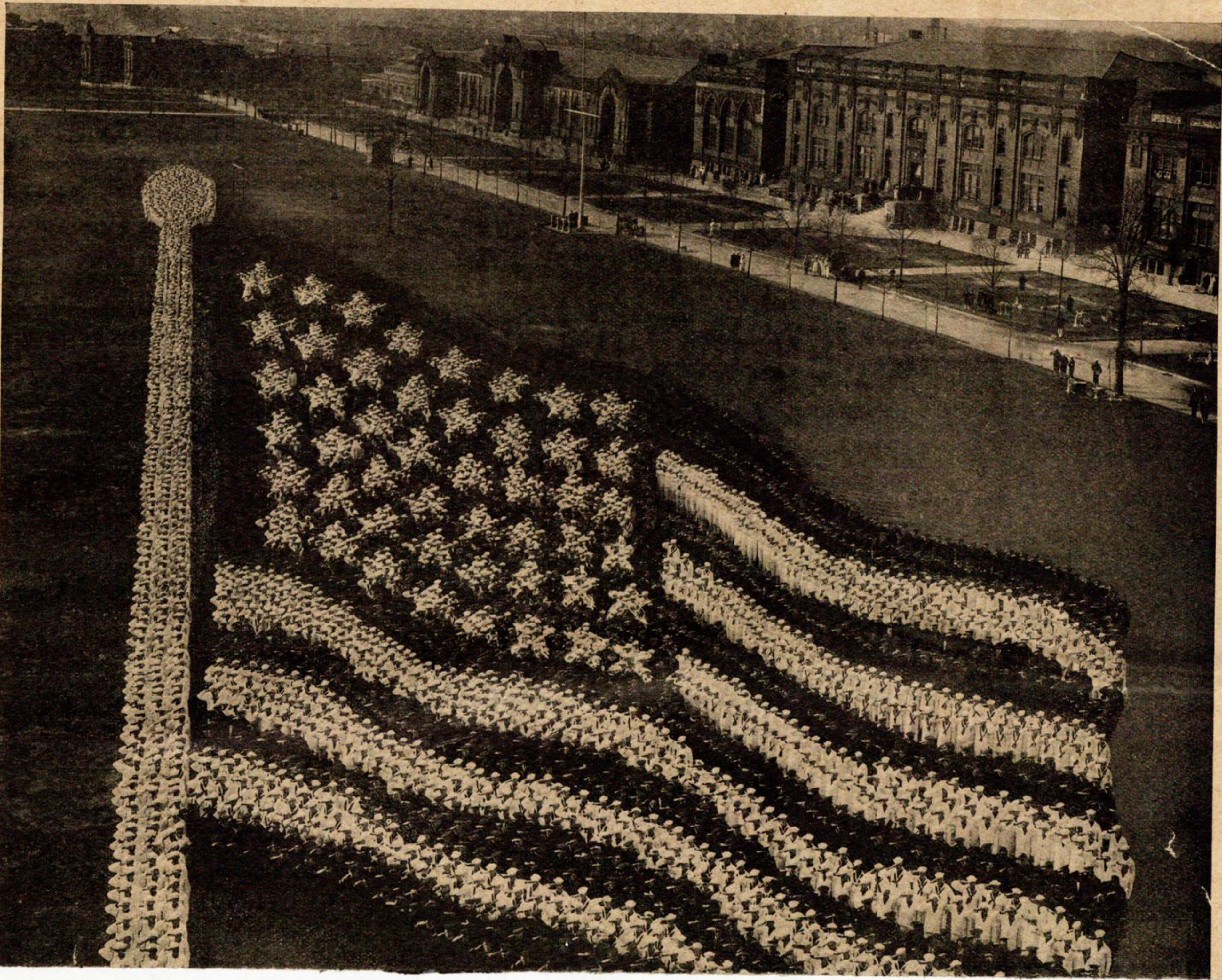

This replica of the National Emblem was made for the Great Lakes Recruit, the monthly naval magazine published at the Great Lakes Naval Training station, and following are some of the dimensions of the flag: There were 290 men in the ball, 560 men in the pole, 450 men in the front stripe, and 300 men in the last stripe. The pole (not including the ball) measured 550 feet in

length, 3½ feet in width at the bottom, and 6 feet in width at the top. The ball measured 237 feet in length and 20 feet in width. The flag itself measured 293 feet in width at the top, 73 feet in length at the bottom, 428 feet in width at the left end and 128 feet in width at the right end. The star field measured 143 feet at the top, 66 feet at the bottom, 350 feet at the left end and 184 feet at the right end.
