

After the said pavement shall be constructed, the same shall be covered with a two (2) inch layer of fine earth, which shall be kept wet with water for a period of ten (10) days, when the said fine earth shall be then removed.

The parkways throughout the course of improvement shall be graded, leveled and smoothed from the top edge of the present concrete sidewalks to the top of the said integral curbs adjacent to said sidewalks, and where there is no sidewalk, the parkways shall be graded, leveled and smoothed from the top of the said integral curbs to the street lines so that there shall be a slope or fall of six (6) inches from said street lines to the tops of the said integral curbs adjacent to said street lines.

Wherever the word "street" is used in this ordinance, except where otherwise specifically limited, it shall include "avenue," "lane" and "road."

Wherever the words "street intersection" are used in this ordinance, they shall mean the place where streets cross, or where streets meet; and said intersections shall be bounded by the street lines extended.

Wherever the words "alley intersection" are used in this ordinance, they shall mean the place where an alley joins or crosses a street and shall be bounded by the alley lines extended.

Wherever the words "street return" are used in this ordinance, they shall mean that portion of the roadway of a street intersection extending from the integral curb line extended of the main pavement back to the street line extended.

Wherever the word "pavement" is used in this ordinance, it shall include the reinforced concrete, the integral curbs, and the asphaltic filler herein provided to be used.

Wherever the word "parkway" is used in this ordinance, it shall mean the space between the integral curb line and the street line, except the space occupied by sidewalk.

Wherever the words "edge of curb" are used in this ordinance, they shall mean that edge or line of the integral curb nearest to the street line.

Wherever the word "subgrade" is used in this ordinance, it shall mean that portion of the roadway which has been prepared as herein provided to receive the paving materials herein provided to be used.

Wherever the word "curb" is used in this ordinance, it shall mean "integral curb" as described and set forth herein.

Wherever the words "finished grade" are used in this ordinance, they shall mean the elevation of the top surface of the pavement at the center line of said pavement when the said pavement is completed, unless otherwise stated, and said elevation shall be expressed in feet and decimals of a foot above Village of Winnetka datum.

Wherever in this ordinance the dimension or size of drain pipe is expressed as "four (4) inch," "eight (8) inch," or "ten (10) inch," said dimension or size shall mean the internal diameter of said pipe.

Wherever the words "combination manholes and catchbasins" are used in this ordinance, they shall be understood to mean combined manholes and catch basins.

The said improvement shall be constructed and completed under the direction and superintendence of the Board of Local Improvements of the Village of Winnetka, and shall be in all respects and particulars as constructed in a workmanlike manner and shall be subject to the approval of the Board of Local Improvements. The said Board of Local Improvements shall employ a competent engineer for the purpose of laying out the said improvement during construction, furnishing to the contractor the lines and grades of the said improvement, including the necessary stakes therefor, and making all necessary examinations of materials and inspection of the said improvement during the construction thereof and when completed.

SECTION 2. That the recommendation of the Board of Local Improvements of the Village of Winnetka providing for said improvement, together with the estimate of the cost of said improvement, made and submitted by the President of the said Board, both hereto attached, be and they are hereby approved.

SECTION 3. That said improvement shall be constructed and the cost thereof be paid by special assessment in accordance with an Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois, entitled "An Act Concerning Local Improvements," approved June 14, A. D. 1897, and the amendments thereto, and that of the amount of said assessment to be collected as aforesaid, the sum of eleven thousand seven hundred six and no/100 dollars (\$11,706.00), which sum does not exceed six (6) per centum of the amount of said assessment, shall be applied so far as may be required to the payment of all lawful expenses attending the proceedings for making said improvement, and the cost of making and collecting the assessment therefor in accordance with the provisions of said Act and the amendments thereto.

SECTION 4. That the aggregate amount herein ordered to be assessed against the property, and also the assessments against each lot or parcel of land assessed shall be divided into ten (10) installments, in the manner provided by statute in such cases, and each of said installments shall bear interest at the rate of five (5) per centum per annum until paid.

SECTION 5. That for the purpose of anticipating the collection of the second and succeeding installments of said assessment, bonds shall be issued, payable out of said installments, bearing interest at the rate of five (5) per centum per annum, payable annually, and signed by the President of the Village of Winnetka and attested by the Clerk of the Village of Winnetka under the corporate seal of the Village of Winnetka. Said bonds shall be issued in accordance with and shall in all respects conform with the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois, entitled "An Act Concerning Local Improvements," approved June 14, A. D. 1897, and the amendments thereto.

SECTION 6. That the Village Attorney be and he is hereby directed to file a petition in the Circuit, Superior or County Court of Cook County, Illinois, in the name of the Village of Winnetka, praying that steps may be taken to levy a special assessment for said improvement in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance and in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 7. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 8. That this ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, approval and posting.

M., and that the record of the minutes of this meeting be published at large in The Winnetka Weekly Talk not less than one week before any further action of this Council shall be taken upon said recommendation, estimate and ordinance, and that the said recommendation, estimate and ordinance be posted by the Village Clerk, as required by ordinance.

The following bills were read and on motion by Trustee Miller, seconded by Trustee Heller, were approved for payment, the President authorized to sign warrants for same and the Clerk to countersign and affix the Village seal. On roll call, Trustees Greeley, Heller, Miller and Wheatley voted aye.

On motion of Trustee Heller, seconded by Trustee Miller and carried, Trustees Greeley, Heller, Miller and Wheatley voting aye, the further consideration of an ordinance for the opening and extension of a new street extending from Ridge Avenue to Oak Street by condemning therefor certain property in Block Thirty-six (36), in the Village of Winnetka was postponed to February 19, 1918.

On motion by Trustee Heller, seconded by Trustee Miller and carried, Trustees Greeley, Heller, Miller and Wheatley voting aye, the further consideration of an ordinance for the improvement of a new seventy-five foot street lying along and adjoining the westerly line of the right of way of the Chicago and Northwestern Railway Company and extending from Ridge Avenue to Oak Street, in the Village of Winnetka, was postponed to February 19, 1918.
