

## PLAN MILITARY BAND FOR NATIONAL GUARD

North Shore Men Meet at Winnetka Community House to Perfect Plans for Reserve Militia Band

### THE WINNETKA MEN JOIN

Musicians of North Shore Requested to Enter New Organization

A Military Band for the North Shore is to become a reality if the plans, now being formulated by leading residents, work out successfully. Such an organization would become a part of the First Regiment, Illinois Reserve Militia, of which most of the companies are composed of north shore men.

At a meeting held in the Winnetka Community House this week, under the direction of regiment officials, the first step in the new project was taken when members of the Winnetka Concert Band agreed to join the proposed organization.

Plans were also perfected for a meeting to be held at the Winnetka Community House on Wednesday evening, March 13, when representatives of all north shore towns are expected to formulate definite plans for organization.

Assurances were given at this week's meeting that Major Lucius Hines, of Highland Park, Commander of the First Battalion of the First Regiment, had expressed great interest in the undertaking and promised to lend all assistance possible to make the proposition a reality.

Men and boys of the North Shore, who can play band instruments, have been asked to attend the meeting next Wednesday and bring along their instruments.

While the proposed band would be a component part of the Reserve Militia regiment and, in that capacity would accompany the regiment in all its drills and marches, it is also designed to be a representative musical organization of the North Shore and to take an active part in all patriotic gatherings.

### PUBLIC SERVICE CO. GAINS CONSENTS ALONG NO. SHORE

Consents of many north shore property owners for a right of way for an extension of the power transmission lines of the Public Service company of Northern Illinois between Evanston and Highland Park was obtained at a hearing held before the public utilities commission at the Insurance Exchange building in Chicago last week. 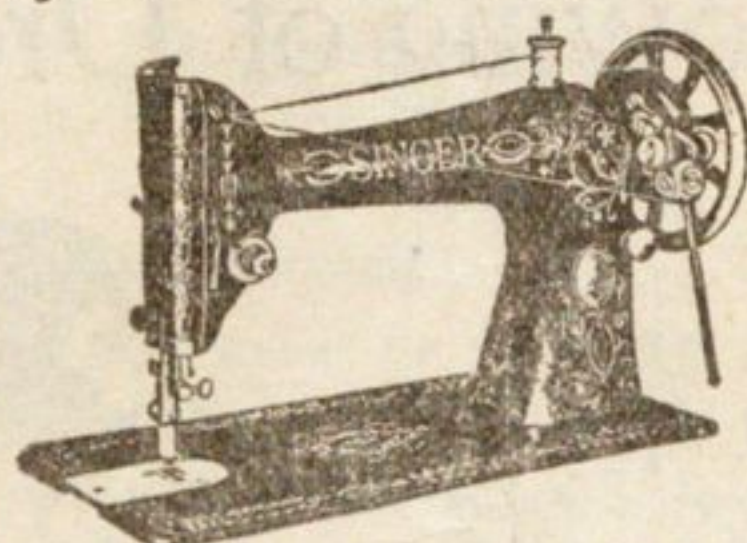
