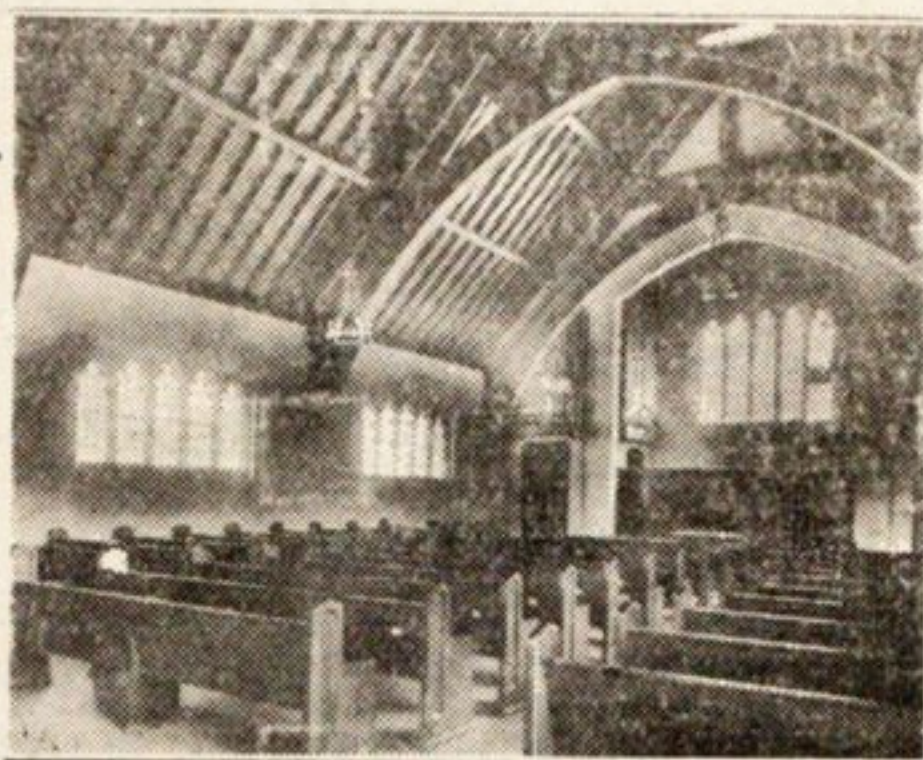
CROWD SCHOOL HALL TO HONOR FIGHTERS

death because he loved his country and freedom more than his life, and his name has been enrolled among that great company of immortals that give to the word freedom, a fuller and richer meaning. Though unknown to most of us personally, he is at last known as one of the world's heroes, and his name is inscribed in our hearts.

The second golden star upon this service flag has been placed there to remind us of one of our boys who, after attracting the attention and admiration of the world as one of the "aces" of the famous Lafayette Escadrille, went down to his death in the German lines. I recall very distinctly this morning the clean-cut, boyish face and the winning smile of Courtney Campbell, as he used to sit before me in the orchestra, nine years ago. He was a boy through and through, and though he was full of the fiery energy of youth and sometimes played pranks, those pranks have long ago been forgotten, and only the matchless heroism of the lad shines forth in undimmed splendor, for Courtney Campbell is New Trier's first martyr to the cause of liberty, and his name is spoken with reverence by all the world. Let us not think of him as dead, nor of Philip Starr as dead, but as living forever in the grateful memories of those who, because of the noble part these two lads played in the great struggle, will find this world a little more safe for democracy."

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that an election of the legal voters of Winnetka Park District will be held on Thursday, April 2, 1918, to elect a Park Commissioner for the term of five years, and until his successor shall be elected and qualified, to succeed William S. Elliott, whose term of office expires; also a Park Commissioner for the remainder of the term of office expiring in April, 1919 left vacant by the resignation of Louis B. Kuppenheimer, also a Park Commissioner for the remainder of the term of office expiring in April, 1920 left vacant by the resignation of John R. Leonard. The polls of said election shall be open from seven o'clock in the morning until five o'clock in the evening of said day.

In the First Election District, comprising all of Winnetka Park District north of the center line of North Avenue, the polling place will be at the polling place for the Township election in the Third Election District of the Town of New Trier, viz: at C. L. Wymann's Store in the Village of Winnetka, one block west of the Hubbard Woods Railway Station.

In the Second Election District, comprising all that portion of Winnetka Park District bounded on the north by the center line of North Avenue, on the east by Lake Michigan, on the south by the center line of Elm Street from Lake Michigan to Lake Avenue and by the center line of Pine Street extended west from Lake Avenue to the west boundary of the Village of Winnetka, and on the west by Lake Avenue and the west boundary of said Village, the polling place will be at the polling place for the Township Election in the Fourth Election District of the Town of New Trier, namely: at Park's Plumbing Shop, Winnetka, Illinois.

In the Third Election District, comprising all of Winnetka Park District in that part of the Village of Winnetka south of the center line of Elm Street and north of the center line of Willow Street, the polling place will be at the polling place for the Township Election in the Fifth Election District of the Town of New Trier, namely: Bartz's Livery Office, Winnetka, Illinois.

In the fourth Election District, comprising all of Section Nineteen (19), Township Forty-two (42) north, Range Thirteen (13) east of the Third Principal Meridian; also all of Winnetka Park District in that part of the Village of Winnetka lying south of the center line of Willow Street; also any other part of Winnetka Park District not lying in the first, second and third election district thereof, the polling place will be at the polling place for the Township Election in the Sixth Election District of the Town of New Trier, namely: Indian Hill Inn, Winnetka, Illinois, near the Indian Hill Railway Station.
