Winnetka, Illinois, April 19, 1918 Notice is hereby given that sealed bids for the construction of the following improvement of Hill Road from the present pavement at the west line extended of Ridge Avenue, . southwesterly to a line running at right angles to the center line of said Hill Road at a point 16.25 feet northeasterly from the intersection of said center line of said Hill Road with the south line of Section Twenty (20), Township Forty-two (42) North. Contractors will be paid in bonds bearing interest at the rate of five per cent (5%) per annum for all estimates approved by the Board of Local Improvements in the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars and over and when the amount of balance due on any estimate is less than the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, the same will be paid by time warrants.

In addition to the usual bond for construction and maintenance in the sum equal to the amount of the bid accepted by the Board of Local Improvements, the successful bidder will be required to furnish an indemnity and defense policy in some reliable company, indemnifying the Village of Winnetka against loss from liability for damages on account of injury or death suffered by reason of the performance of the work required to be performed by the said contractor, by any person or persons, including such liability imposed under the employers' liability and workmen's compensation law of the State of Illinois, and the amendments thereto, in the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars.


