2. Cutting and destruction of weeds from lot line to lot line along all highways in New Trier Township from Skokie Road to County Line Road, and from Sheridan Road to the New Trier Township west limits, both sides of all roads herein named included.

Work to be commenced within three days after the letting of contracts and to be completed within thirty days after work is started.
