can be successfully canned without sugar or sweetening of any kind, and later sweetened when opened for use. Canning without sugar will be successful, providing the ingredients are cooked twice as long as they would be with the usual amount of sugar in them.

If jam or marmalade is made, which requires more sugar than canned fruits, less than the usual "half and half" amount should be used, and the ingredients cooked longer.

Extreme care should be taken in sealing properly all fruits and vegetables.

It is important during the present season to consider what vegetables to select for canning and the most economical procedure to use. The following suggestions should have general value:

Do not can vegetables that can be dried.

Do not can vegetables which can be matured to form a more nutritious food. Lima beans and others are examples of this class.

Root crops like beets and carrots should be stored instead of canned. Some products like tomatoes can be concentrated in purees and pastes and thus take up less space.

Pea-pods can be boiled down and canned as a puree for soups.

All canned vegetables when opened should be boiled for two minutes no matter how they are to be used.

Drying furnishes a good substitute for canning and when properly done gives attractive and wholesome products. Much space in storing and expense of containers are saved.

Sugar is scarce—Jars are high, so dry, dry, dry!

#### Food Resolutions

That the problem of Food control is a colossal one fraught with great difficulties.

That the Food Administration works along three lines—Production, Distribution and Consumption. Under the latter comes Conservation. The first can be encouraged and stimulated; the second controlled by law; the third—by education alone.

That the program must be a flexible one as conditions change with seasons and in different parts of the country. We feel that this point is particularly important because it is an answer to much of the criticism regarding changes in recommendations. The attitude seems to be that the errors. Everything possible should be done to change this impression.

That the carrying out of this program is in the hands of people who are wiser than we and that we must think of ourselves as soldiers under superior officers—must do as they direct and not question as to the wisdom of the proceeding. A soldier does not question—he obeys.

That even though we have a huge crop this season and large supplies of other foods; the surplus must go into storage to avert famine later on.

A simple explanation of the law of supply and demand based on the following: arbitrary regulation of prices has a tendency to reduce production—if consumption is increased production is stimulated which in creases the supply, thereby automatically reducing prices.


## The Line Is Busy
