FITTED FOR THE OFFICES

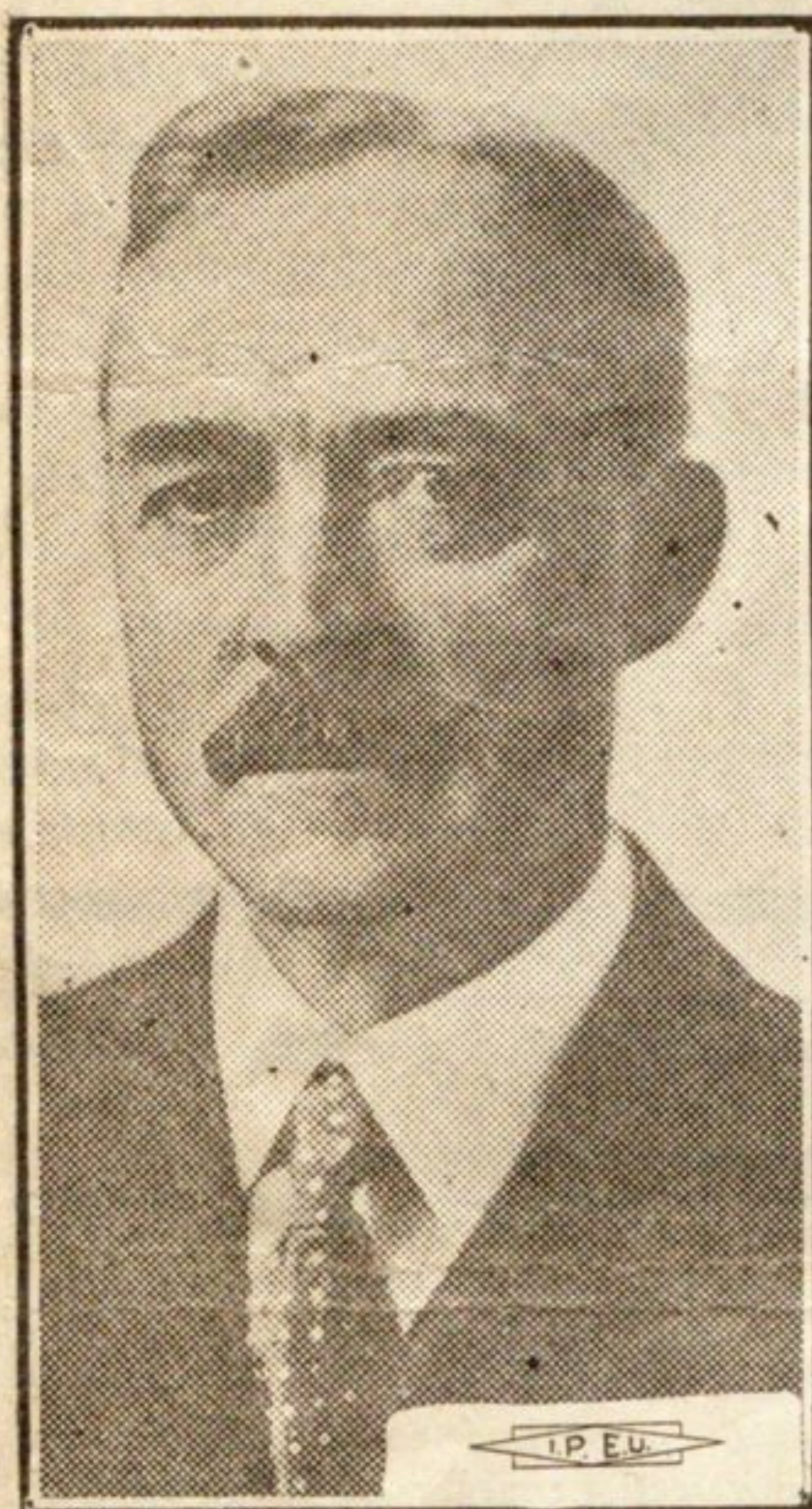
Both Men Are Endorsed By Real

He is a graduate of the Chicago Public schools and Northwestern University, and a member of the Chicago Real Estate Board, the Chicago Association of Commerce, Chicago Athletic association, Evanston club, Evanston Country club and Glen View club.

Mr. Bass has resided on the north shore for 35 years and has always been active in civic and social betterment work. His candidacy was endorsed by practically all the real estate men of Chicago and Cook county towns. His only son Perkins B. Bass, Jr., now 20 years of age, enlisted in the 17th regiment of Engineers and has been in service in France for over a year.

Charles Ringer has been engaged in the real estate business for the past 22 years. Two years ago he was elected to fill an unexpired term of assessor the duties of which office he has discharged to the satisfaction of the people and with high credit to himself.

Mr. Ringer is an active member of both the Cook County Real Estate Board and the Chicago Real Estate Board as well as the City club and the Hamilton club. He has been president of his local Business Men's association and affiliated with several improvement clubs. It was due largely to his efforts that Chicago secured the fine municipal bathing beach at Windsor Park which when

completed will be one of the finest in the world.

CALL TO DUTY

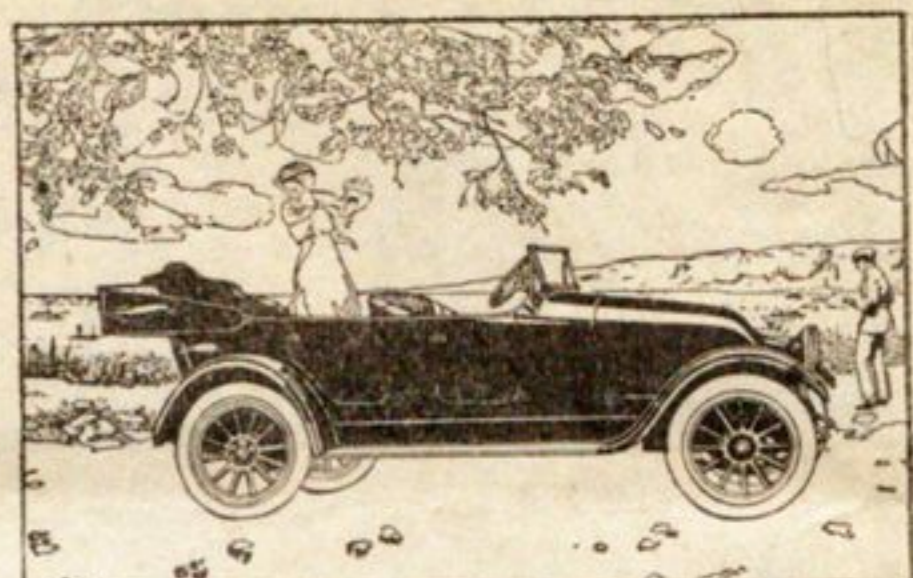
From the battle fields in France there comes an unspoken call that
