Only one death has occurred within the week, making a total of three deaths in the Village from this disease. Michael Felosco, 17 years old, 387 Provident avenue, died at the Chicago Union hospital on October 6.

Until such time as the Health commissioner rescinds the closing order the strict quarantine rules will be enforced. Parents are warned that violators will be summarily prosecuted. Physicians and attendants have been lax in reporting cases at the time of their development, according to the Health authorities, and are urged to make their reports to the health department after symptoms of the epidemic become apparent.


