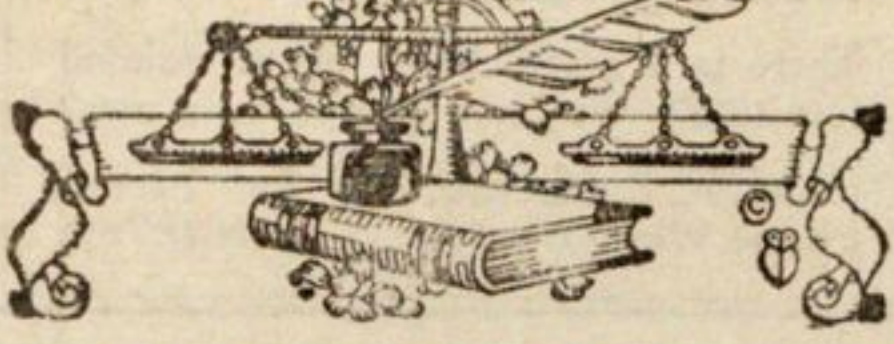
George Arns Goes To Sea

NOTICE.

Winnetka, Ill., November 29, 1918. Notice is hereby given that sealed bids for the construction of the following improvement of ESSEX ROAD, from the north line extended of Warwick Avenue north for a distance of ninety-one (91) feet, being the Essex Road frontage of the south ninety-one (91) feet of Lot Thirteen (13) Block one (1) of Tempel's Resubdivision, by excavating, grading, preparing the subgrade, constructing a Portland cement concrete integral curb, constructing a reinforced Portland cement concrete pavement, joints and edges protected by steel, asphalt felt filled protection plates, in the Village of Winnetka, County of Cook and State of Illinois, said improvement and assessment being otherwise known as Winnetka Special Assessment No. 339,467 in accordance with the ordinance heretofore passed therefor, will be received by the Board of Local Improvements of the Village of Winnetka by or before eight o'clock P. M., on Tuesday the tenth day of December, A. D. 1918, at which hour all bids will be opened at a meeting to be held in the Council Chamber of the Village Hall, in the said Village of Winnetka, Cook County, Illinois. The specifications of said improvement are on file in the office of the Clerk of said Village of Winnetka. Contractors will be paid in bonds bearing interest at the rate of five per cent (5%) per annum for all estimates approved by the Board of Local Improvements in the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and over, from the second and subsequent installments of

said Special Assessment, and when the amount of balance due on any estimate is more than the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and no further bonds may be issued against the second and subsequent installments of said Special Assessment, and when the amount of balance due on any estimate is less than the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), the same will be paid by time warrants.

The successful bidder for the construction of said improvement will be required to enter into bond in the sum equal to the amount of such bid, with sureties to be approved by the President of the Board of Local Improvements of the Village of Winnetka and filed with the said Board of Local Improvements, which bond shall provide that the contractor shall well and faithfully perform and execute said work in all respects according to the complete and detailed specifications and full and complete drawings, profiles and models thereof and according to the time and terms and conditions of the contract, and also that such bidder and contractor shall promptly pay all debts incurred by such bidder or contractor in the prosecution of such work, including those for labor and materials furnished, and that suit may be brought on such bond in case of default or failure to pay such debts promptly, by and in the name of the Village of Winnetka, for all damages sustained either by the said Village or by any person or party interested, or for the damages sustained by the said Village and all parties in interest, or by any beneficiary or party interested in the name of the Village of Winnetka for the use of the party interested as beneficial plaintiff, to recover for any labor and materials furnished. All bids or proposals shall contain an offer to furnish such bond upon the acceptance of such bid or proposal.

In addition to the bond required as above set forth, and for construction and maintenance, the successful bidder will be required to furnish an indemnity and defense policy in some reliable company, indemnifying the Village of Winnetka against loss from liability for damages on account of injury or death suffered by reason of the performance of the work required to be performed by the said contractor, by any person or persons, including such liability imposed under the Employers' Liability and Workmen's Compensation law of the State of Illinois, and the amendments thereto, in the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00).
