# "ROOSEVELT OF CHINA"

Dr. Ng Poon Chew, Chinese Editor in California and Leader in Missions, Coming to Sunday Evening Club

## SPEAKS OF MODERN CHINA

Will Discuss Problems of International Import Affecting Great Nation of the East

China's Struggle for Democracy" will be the subject of the address given at the joint meeting of the Wilmette Sunday Evening club and Wilmette Church Union on Sunday evening, February 23. The speaker will be Dr. Ng Poon Chew, who has frequently been styled "The Roosevelt of China." Dr. Chew is the editor of the first Chinese daily paper to be published in the United States. He is prominent in the Presbyterian church of California, and is a great believer in the efficacy of missions.

Family of Leaders

Dr. Chew's wife was the founder of the first Chinese Y. W. C. A. in the United States. One of his daughters was the first Chinese to teach in the public schools of this country, and another daughter was 545 Vernon avenue, Glencoe. 


