Mr. and Mrs. Frederick Armstrong will leave Wilmette Sunday for their

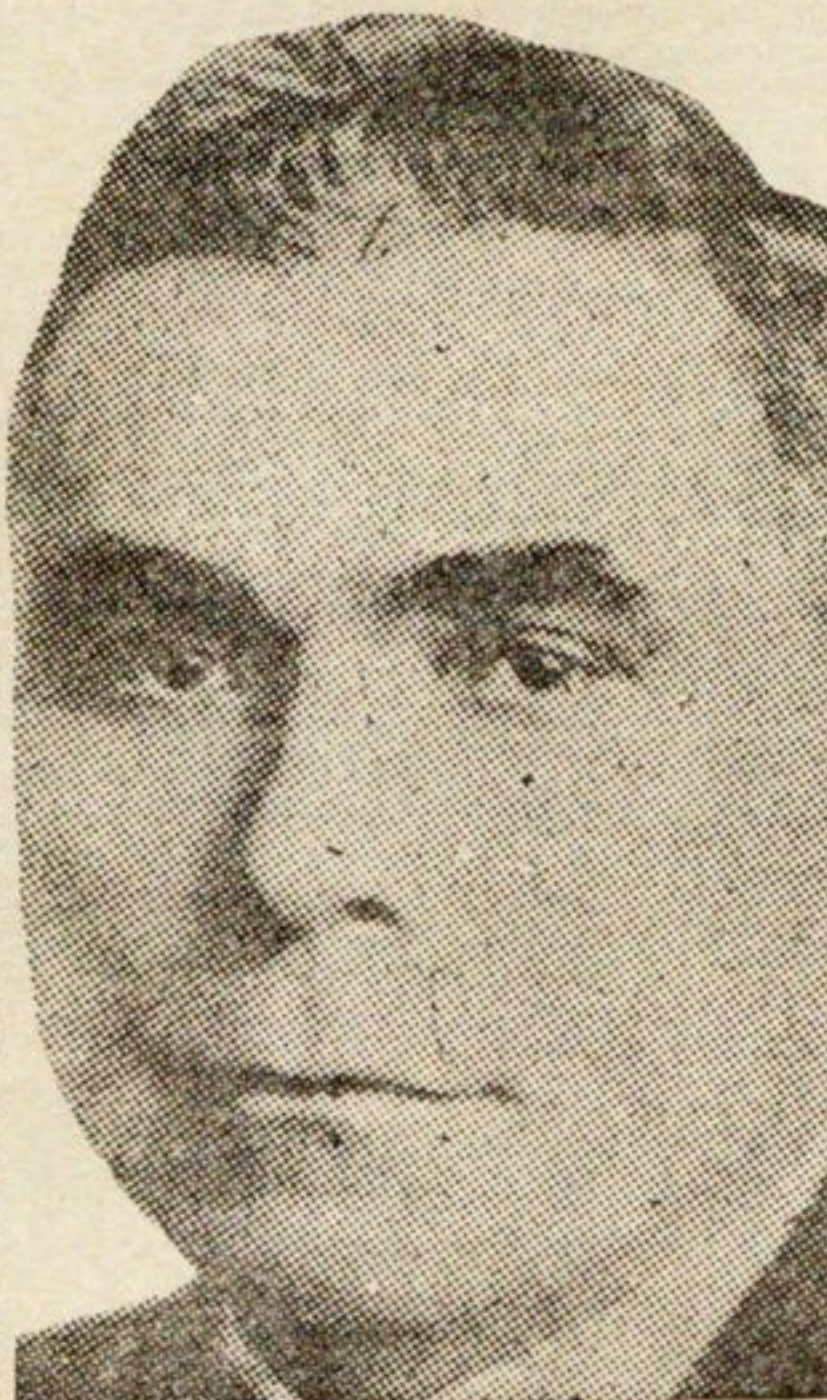
new home in Duluth, Minnesota. Mrs. Armstrong is the daughter of Mrs. Charles McCue of 631 Washington avenue.

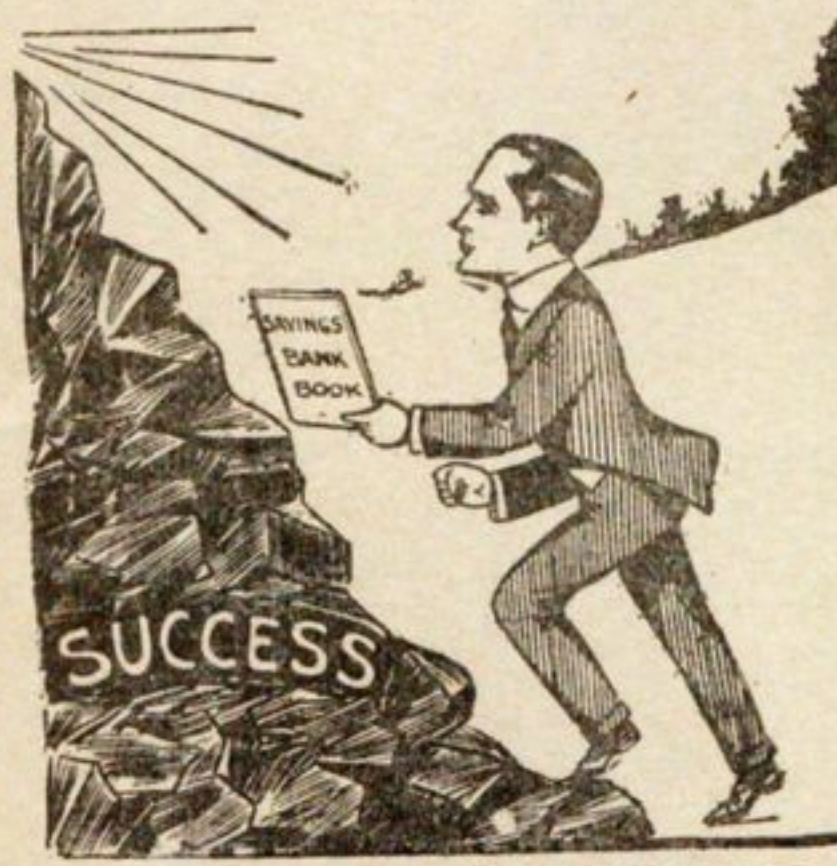

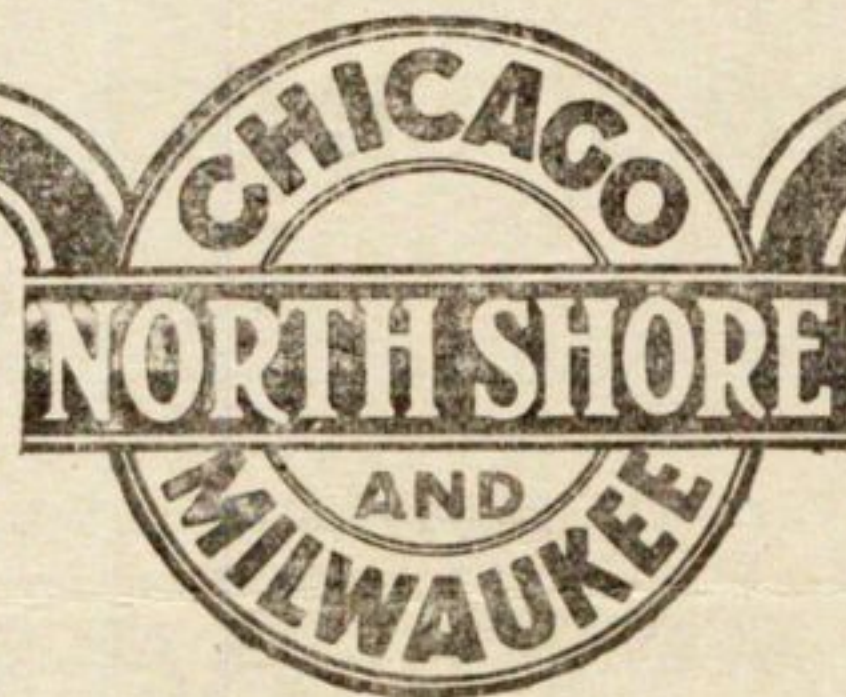
