SHELL SHOCK YANKS
EARN MONEY MAKING
ARTICLES AT POST

The shell shocked men at Fort Sheridan are being taught various kinds of "hand craft" by workers who have spent a great deal of time in learning these different kinds of work in the hospitals. Polishing wood, stenciling, carving, painting and weaving are among the kinds of work the men are doing and the excellent quality of their work and the interest they take in it is remarkable as well as pathetic.

A large number of oilcloth mats have been made by men in the different wards. These mats are made of different colored oilcloths which are to be cut into any size desired and are to be used as doilies. Designs are painted on them and they are very attractive to use in a summer home. This sort of work is the first thing that the reconstruction workers give to the men to try to interest them in something, and it is only in this way that their condition can be improved.

Utter lack of interest is the hardest condition the workers among the shell shocked men have to contend with and that condition is present in almost every case of shell shock, so when the patients become sufficiently interested in work of some kind the physicians feel that they are on the rapid road to recovery. Soldiers are taking orders for work of this kind which are sent in by north shore people interested in the work at Fort Sheridan. The completed articles go through the sales department but each soldier who makes the article receives a certain amount himself for the article sold. This does a great deal towards stimulating the interest in the making of the different articles.

N. E. A. THRIFT PLAN

War Savings Educational and Sales Campaign to be Part of School Work

As the result of an appeal from Secretary of the Treasury Glass that thrift be made a part of the curriculum in every school in the United States, the National Education association, in session in Chicago last Friday, went on record in favor of the thrift plan outlined by the secretary. Thrift lessons already have been made part of the study course in all the schools of Illinois.

The appeal from Secretary Glass was presented to the convention in the form of a telegram. Then a resolution was adopted putting the national educators on record for the school plan and arranging for the appointment of a committee of the educators to put the plan in execution. Following is the text of the resolution:

"As essential to character formation, to the welfare of the American people, and to the promotion of a national habit, we urge that the present national program of thrift instruction, and the sale of Thrift and War Savings stamps become a permanent part of the public school procedure.

"We recommend that a committee of the National Education association be named to co-operate with the Savings division of the Treasury department in pushing a campaign in all State School systems."

A special Thrift and War Savings number of National School Service, the organ of the Division of Educational Extension, Department of Interior, was issued March 1 and sent to every school teacher in the United States. The number contains twenty-one columns of articles, illustrations and photographs on thrift, including teachers' help for rural schools, primary, intermediate and upper grades and high schools.

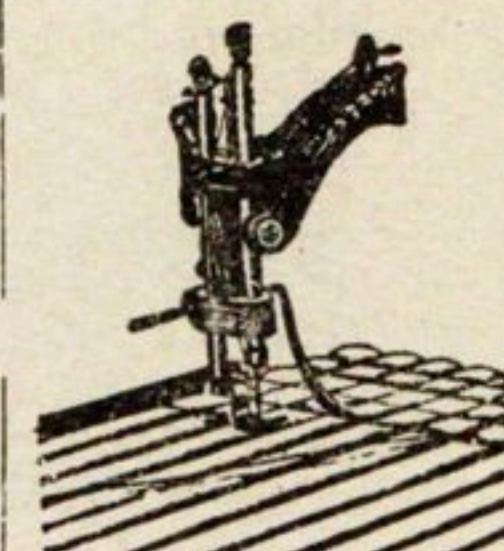
