

BIG VICTORY LOAN CAMPAIGN APRIL 21

Secretary Glass announced that the campaign for the Victory Liberty loan will open April 21 and close Saturday, May 10. During that period short term notes to the extent of \$7,000,000,000 will have to be disposed of.

The notes will mature in from one to five years. The rate of interest has not been fixed, but it is generally believed that it will be 4 1/2 per cent. The last Liberty loan was issued at 4 1/4 per cent, but on account of the super-taxes and profit-taxes under the war revenue bill it has been found that it would be impossible to float another issue at that low rate.

In arriving at the decision to issue short-term notes rather than long-term bonds for the Victory loan, Secretary Glass says he has done so because he believes the notes for short term will be maintained at par with more facility than would bonds of longer maturity.

Secretary Glass appeals to the people to support the loan in the same patriotic manner in which the previous Liberty loans were supported. Unless people generally subscribe, he says, the burden of subscription will fall upon the banks, and in his opinion, this would be a misfortune.

WINNETKA PARK DISTRICT

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that an election of the legal voters of Winnetka Park District will be held on Tuesday, April 1, 1919, to elect a Park Commissioner for the term of five years, and until his successor shall be elected and qualified; also a Park Commissioner for the remainder of the term of office expiring in April, 1922, left vacant by the resignation of Lawrence Howe. Nelson, Winnetka Illinois.

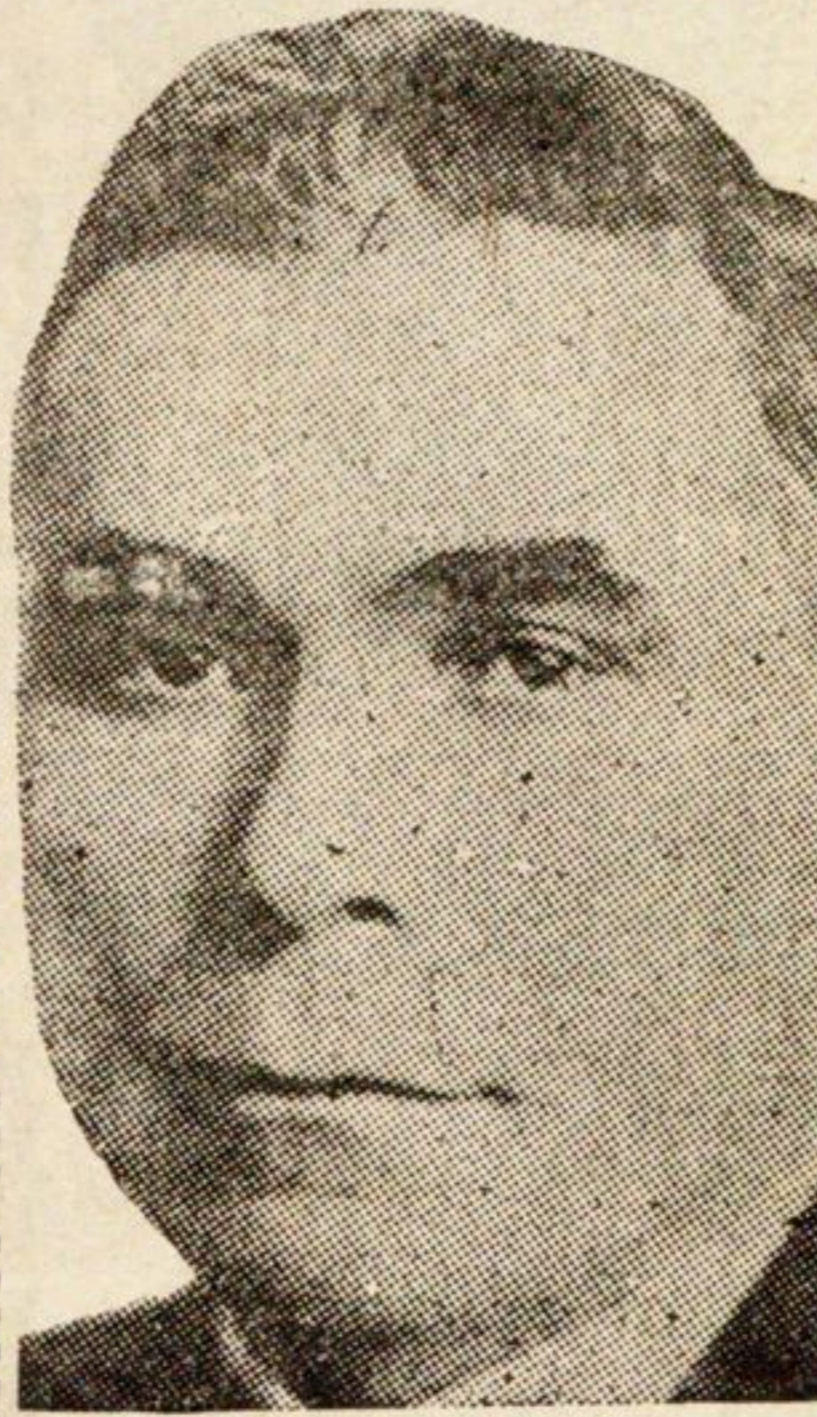
In the Third Election District, comprising all of Winnetka Park District in that part of the Village of Winnetka south of the center line of Elm Street and north of the center line of Willow Street, the polling place will be at the polling place of the Township Election in the Fifth Election District of the Town of New Trier, namely: Bartz's Livery Office, Winnetka, Illinois.

In the Fourth Election District, comprising all of Section Nineteen (19), Township Forty-two (42) north, Range Thirteen (13) east of the Third Principal Meridian; also all of Winnetka Park District in that part of the Village of Winnetka lying south of the center line of Willow Street, also any other part of Winnetka Park District not lying in the first, second and third election districts thereof, the polling place will be at the polling place for the Township Election in the Sixth Election District of the Town of New Trier, namely: Indian Hill Inn, Winnetka, Illinois, near the Indian Hill Railway Station.

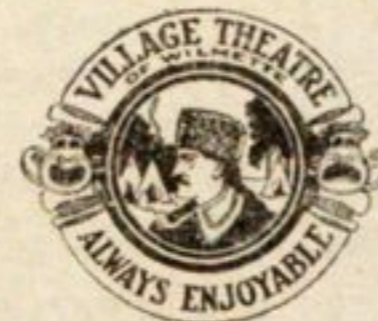
