"Later on the only cars which will be available for quick delivery will be the poorer and less desirable makes, which both do not sell readily under normal conditions."

Those people who are particular as to what kind of car they ride in will either have to walk or to wait a long time, unless they place their orders early, according to Cunningham.

In spite of the snowy weather of the past few weeks, which was not favorable for the automobile business, his sales show the following totals: One Ford chassis, three Ford runabouts, seven Ford touring cars, two Ford coupes, two Ford one-ton trucks, one Oldsmobile-Six touring car, one Oldsmobile sedan and one Davis-Six touring car.

ISSUE PASSES FOR MEN SERVING OVER THERE

It is reported in the Stars and Stripes, the official paper of the American expeditionary forces, that different classes of leaves are going to be given to the men in France who wish to visit Paris and London or other points of interest before returning to the States. Men who have relatives on the other side are to be given fourteen days' leave and they may go to England, Belgium, France or Italy.

Men who are granted these passes must be of "exceptionally good character and military record who may be expected to conduct themselves properly at all times and have sufficient funds for the journey."

While on these leaves the men will be given sixty cents a day for rations. Only men who have spent four months or a longer period of time in France will be granted these leaves.
