Charles Edward, the grandson of James II of England, sometimes called Bonnie Prince Charlie, was known as the young pretender, son of James II. At the time of the rising of 1745 he was at one time very near entering London, but the fatality that hung over the Stuarts overwhelmed him. He retreated to Scotland, where he and his army were utterly routed at Culloden. With him the direct line of the Stuarts became extinct. He died January 31, 1788.

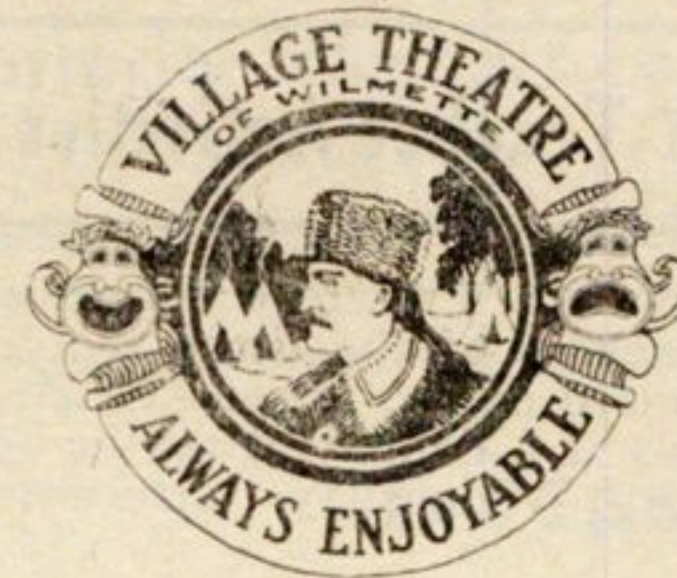

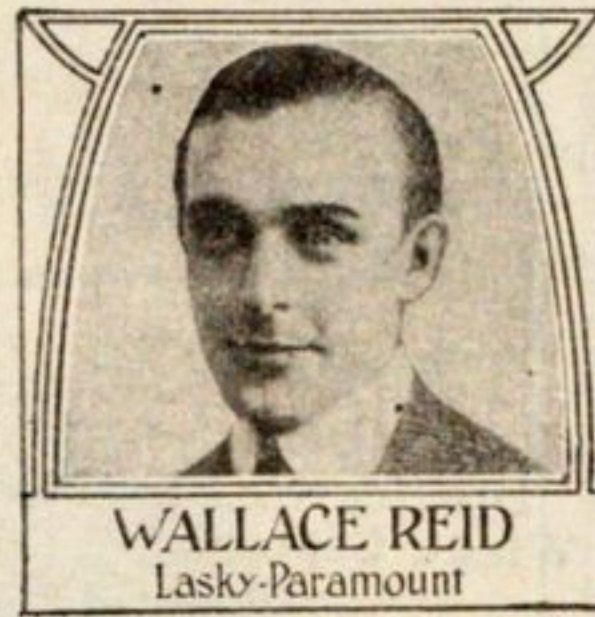

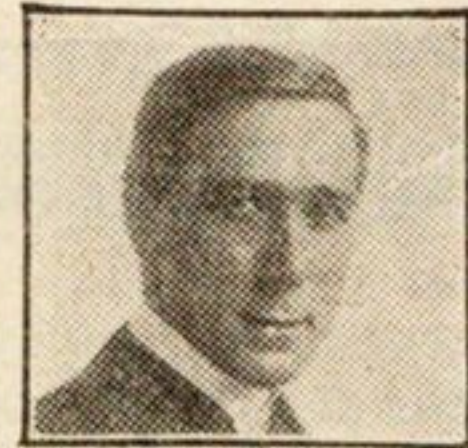
