5--Foreign substance added.

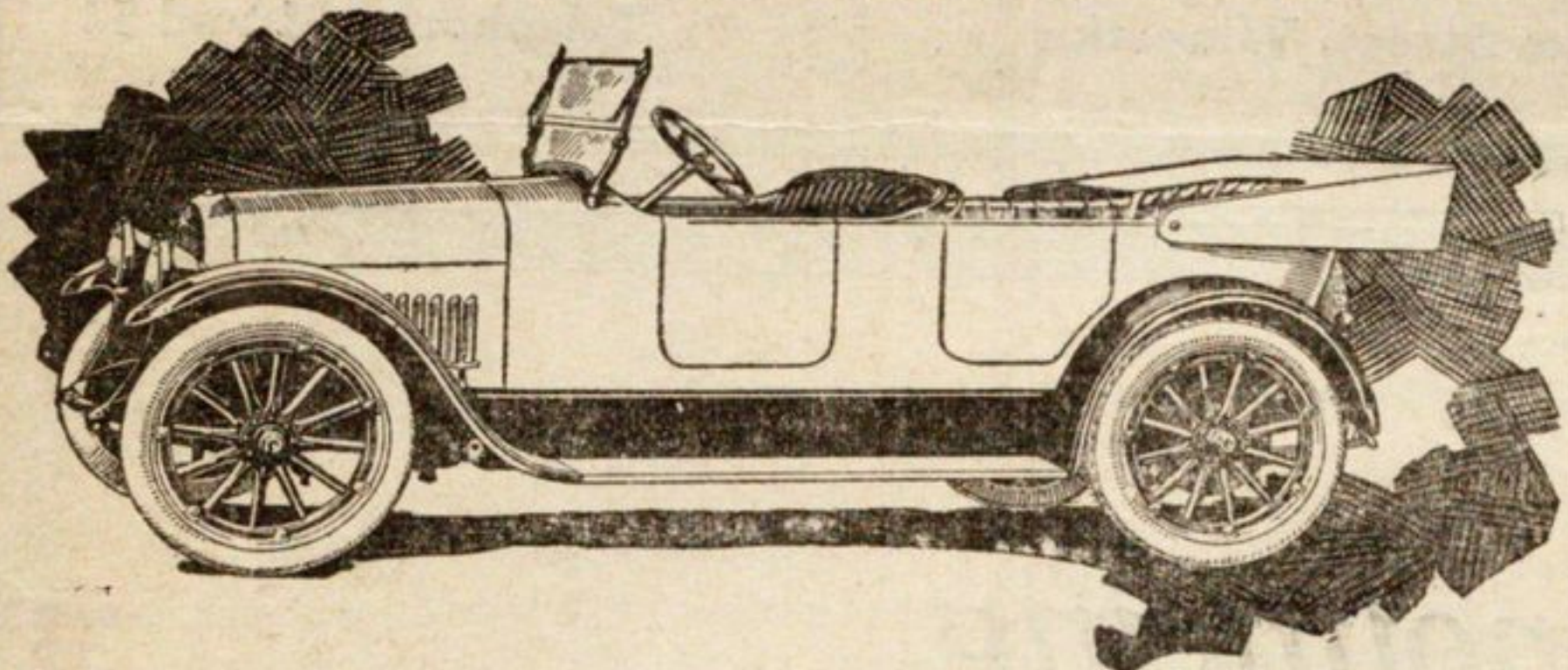
