Her life is not very merry with us; it is entirely the life of a missionary, but she loves us and pities us, and that is why Madame, we will be very willing to have her return home for several months and rest, and then return to us again. Our little orphans will suffer greatly without her, because she makes them happy, while at the same time caring for them with the tenderness of a mother. All the inhabitants of the surrounding villages venerate her and wish also for her to remain here, because at all times, day or night, in spite of the bad mountain roads, always for the slightest ailment, she is at their bedside, a thing they have never been accustomed to. You would hardly believe, Madame, how many ill people Dr. Brown has rescued from death during the epidemic of Spanish grippe, which is the reason she is sought in a radius of twenty miles. You wish to take her from us, but know that she is our sun, and that without the sun one cannot live! After she has rested we want her to return to comfort our souls as well as our bodies, because she is our great friend. Please, Madame, thank all the people who have worked for the French refugees and orphans; these acts of generosity will always remain engraven in our memories and will make us love more than ever the Americans.
