The Rainbow division is to arrive in this country April 27. The war department has announced that more than 4,500 officers and men of the Rainbow division have sailed from France. They are aboard four warships, the battleships Minnesota and South Carolina, due at Newport News, and the cruisers North Carolina and Montana, due at New York. As soon as the members of the 149th field artillery Fathers and Mothers' association heard that the regiment had sailed from France they began plans for the welcome home. The association which met Sunday to arrange the welcome celebration, will give a festival in the Second Regiment armory next Friday night.

**PARCEL POST TO  
MEN IN THE A. E. F.**

Word has been received at the post office from the war department that families still having someone abroad in the American expeditionary forces may now send them parcel post packages without the signed order of the boy they wish to send the package to. The only stipulation is that the package must not weigh more than seven pounds. The order as received from the department is as follows: "The order prohibiting the acceptance of parcels for mail to the American expeditionary forces

in Europe, unless the proved order for the article can be shown from the addressee accompanies the parcel to be sent, is hereby revoked at the request of the war department."

**American Newspaper History**

Benjamin Franklin contributed much to the development of journalism in colonial days. An editor at the age of sixteen, and a prolific writer, he was identified at some time or another in his life with many of the newspapers which flourished during this period. The oldest newspaper in the United States, which has been continued without interruption of issue or change of name, is the New Hampshire Gazette. It was first published in Portsmouth, N. H., in 1756.

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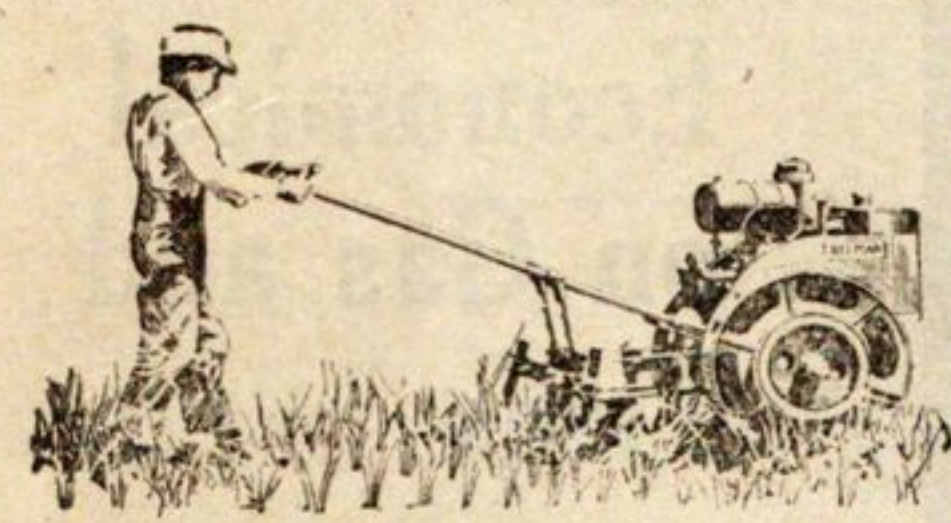
