More Gardens This Year

The fact that the war is over does not mean that folks are going to stop making gardens. The interest that thousands of patriotic gardeners had last year seems to be growing instead of lagging, and their enthusiasm has attracted others to the gardening habit. A report from the Iowa State club leader shows that the enrollment in city garden clubs in that state indicates a marked increase over last year. Up to the last of March the enrollment in Des Moines showed 2,000 more members than were registered a year ago. Of 107 Iowa cities reporting, 91 had already enrolled paid garden club supervisors for the summer, more than twice as many as had paid supervisors last summer.
