Churches of every denomination will lend their aid to the national Thrift Campaign. Pastors has promised to lay before their people on Thrift Sunday the personal and patriotic reasons for perpetuating the lessons of sane saving, wise spending, and safe investment, which the American people learned through the self-sacrifice imposed by the war.

Each congregation will receive a direct message from Secretary Glass of the Treasury Department, to be read from the pulpit, setting forth the reasons why the government is fostering the spirit of thrift as a permanent American characteristic. Pastors have been asked to devote at least a part of their sermons on Thrift Sunday to the subject of saving. A letter to the pastors of all denominations, sent by Harold Braddock, Director of the Savings Division, is in part as follows:

"We are hoping you will be able to assist the local savings director on the Savings Campaign in his community, and that you will impress upon the members of the organizations connected with your church the desirability of careful saving for some worthy object. It would seem that, in the organizations which are desirous for saving for this purpose, it would be to their interest to be enrolled as Government Savings societies. The Savings and Thrift Stamp securities offered by the government are so safe and so accessible to the investor of such small amounts that we feel that they should be well adapted to the needs of any such organizations. We also feel that if the members of these organizations begin investing their savings in Government securities it will aid the members to feel that they have a more direct stake and interest in their Government, and make them more active and intelligent citizens.


